

Sermon followed by Service

January 16, 2022

Ephesians 3:14-21

Do you have time to run out of gas? I have a bad habit of letting my gas tank get too empty for my wife. And when I try to excuse myself: “But I didn’t have time,” what’s the answer back? “Do you have time to run out of gas.” Five minutes at the gas station or who knows how long stuck at the side of the road. If we don’t have time to run out of gas, we better find time to gas up.

What is true with our cars is true for our brains and bodies as well. Skip a meal, wait too long to eat, and what can happen? Our minds turn to mush and everything takes longer. Or we get impatient and hangry - if we don’t have food to bite, we bite at each other. We may have thought we didn’t have time to eat, but what do we find? Fixing our mind-mush mistakes and healing the hearts we hurt takes even longer.

What is true for cars and for brains and bodies is also true for our hearts and souls. So, as we begin this new year, how’s your heart-tank, your heart and soul-tank? Filled-up full for all you have ahead of you? Or are you feeling a bit empty, feeling the gas-gauge go down? Our lesson today helps us fill up and fuel up.

Our lesson is a prayer ... or about a prayer, Paul’s prayer for his people.

What do you want people to pray for you? Better health, better job, that your car make it through COVID, that you have enough money to get ahead or keep ahead of the bills? What do you want people to pray for you? That God changes the world, that God makes the world right for you and yours? When Paul prayed for his people, that’s not what he prayed for, at least not here. Paul wasn’t praying that God change the world around us and make the world right for us. No, Paul prayed that God change us, that God change us inside, to make us strong and powered for life, no matter what the world is doing around us.

How does that sound? Which would you rather have? Your world made right for you? Or your insides made strong for you? My first thought is to pray that God fix my world for me: “God make my life better, easier, happier; God,

make life go good for me!” But what happens if my insides are hollow and empty? A better life on the outside will be just as hollow and empty, never enough. What happens if my insides are all anxious and worried, stressed and on edge? If I’m set on all that’s wrong about me and around me, I probably won’t see how good God is blessing me, will I? And if my insides are weak and worn inside, it won’t matter how good God blesses around me, I’ll be too weak and worn to appreciate God’s blessing.

So Paul didn’t just pray that God give us better outsides, or that God fill our lives with good, but Paul prayed that God fill us with God. Why God and not just good? Because God created us to be with him and like him, and filled with him. So what happens when we’re not filled with him? There is an emptiness, a darkness, a deadness, a hole in us that sucks the life and the love and the hope right out of us. And trying to fill that hole, trying to make ourselves feel full and alive with the stuff of this world, with chocolates and beers, with work and busy-ness, with fun and games - no matter how good those things can be with God, without God they will always leave us running on empty.

So what did Paul pray? **“I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power in your inner being.”** Paul’s not asking for dollars from an empty wallet, food from an empty pantry, gas from an empty tank, power from a dead battery, or love from a cold, empty heart. God has all the riches of heaven and earth ... and for his children God has the heart to give his children whatever we need. So Paul doesn’t just pray for a better life on the outside, Paul prays for our insides. He prays for power, power to brace you, support you, reinforce you. Power to invigorate you, charge you, to make you strong on the inside.

Please don’t get the wrong idea about that strength and power. When we think of strong, we often think independent, strong-willed, standing on our own. It’s easy to think that strong people make things right, they make life right by what they say and do. That’s not God’s way to strength. And that’s not God’s way to make life right. God’s strength comes through connection; “worse,” God’s way to strength is through dependance. We don’t like that word “dependance” or the feeling of dependance, do we? Dependance can feel weak; dependance can feel out of control. With all that’s going on around us, we want to feel strong and in control, don’t we? Not dependance. But what is faith? Dependance. Dependance on God’s plan and promises; dependance on God’s strength; dependance on God’s way. That dependance, instead of leaving us weak and out of control, that

dependance is what makes us strong with the strength of God himself, because through dependance on Jesus, through faith in Jesus, we have Jesus - God himself! - living in us!

Depending on Christ, we get to be strong inside. Does COVID have you feeling kaput or crazed? Do worries at work have you on edge? Are you feeling sapped by the stress of life? Think of God's power in Jesus - you saw just a bit of it as he changed the water into wine. Baptized into Christ, you get to face the world knowing you have Jesus living in you; you get to face the world with God's promise to make all things work for your good. How about that for strength?! Do failure and guilt ever eat away at you? Think of God's love in Jesus - crossed by Christ, your guilt is paid for; you don't have to pay; you don't have to beat yourself up - you get to live forgiven because you are forgiven! How about that for strength?! Do the demands of life drain you? Covered by Christ, all the biggest demands are already taken care of - you're already right by God. You get to face the world approved by God; how about that for strength?! Does the thought of death and dealing with death get you down? Even in the valley of the shadow of death we get to be strong; we have the promise of Jesus - "because I live, you also will live." No matter what is sapping you, draining you, getting you down, with Christ, we get to be strong inside.

Sometimes when we're trying to be strong with Jesus, we don't know how to do the strong thing. We want to be strong and steady, but instead just show ourselves to be stubborn and stuck on self. Sometimes, we want to be strong and encouraging, but when things aren't going our way, we get impatient and pushy. We want to be strong for what's right, but sometimes we get mixed up on God's way and my way, God's right and my right. Sometimes instead of being strong with Jesus, what comes out of us is the weakness of the world.

And so Paul prays. And we pray for ourselves and for each other - not just that we be strong, but that we be strong with Jesus as people rooted and established in love. Rooted and established in love we don't find our strength in bullish or biting words. Rooted and established in love we don't find our strength in muscle or mass. Rooted and established in love we don't find our strength by putting other people down and in their place. No, rooted and established in love, we find our strength in the love of Jesus.

Strength to forgive with the heart of our Father.

Strength to sacrifice (sacrifice self) with the heart of Jesus.

Strength to be gentle, strength to be patient with the fruit of the Spirit.

Strength to persevere in the face of trouble.
Strength to hope and cheer in the face of death.
Strength to live a life of victorious love, because we are filled to the full with
God.

Where do we get that kind of power and strength? Through dependance and faith. **“Faith [that] comes from hearing the message ... the message [that] is heard through the word of Christ.”** Do you find your soul-tank running empty? Do you hear yourself resorting to the strength of the world? Before your tank runs empty, before you resort to the ways of the world, let’s go to God’s power-source, the Gospel, to be filled to the full with God. Then, no matter what the world throws at you, no matter how the world reacts to you, you will be tapped into the power of God and his love, with God himself filling you and powering you.

“Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen.”

John 2:1-11

On the third day a wedding took place at Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no more wine."

“Woman, why do you involve me?” Jesus replied. “My hour has not yet come.”

His mother said to the servants, “Do whatever he tells you.”

Nearby stood six stone water jars, the kind used by the Jews for ceremonial washing, each holding from twenty to thirty gallons.

Jesus said to the servants, “Fill the jars with water”; so they filled them to the brim.

Then he told them, “Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet.”

They did so, and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realize where it had come from, though the servants who had drawn the water knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside and said, “Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now.”

What Jesus did here in Cana of Galilee was the first of the signs through which he revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

SERMON

CONFESSION OF FAITH

NICENE CREED

P: Hear us, Lord, as we pray in silence.

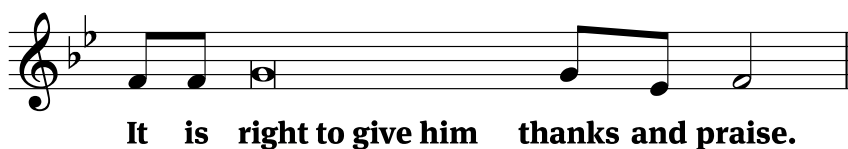
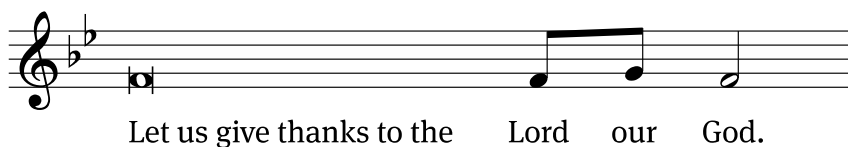
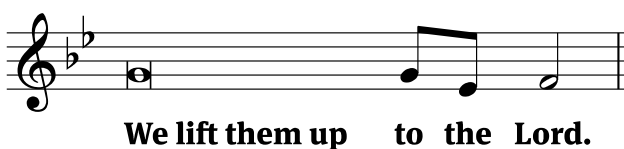
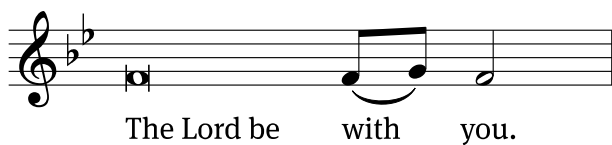

The peace of the Lord be with you always.


