

Sermon followed by Service

July 9, 2023

1 Kings 19:9 -

If you want somebody's attention, you have a choice - you can shout or you can whisper. But if you want to talk love, shouting at them isn't the best way to hug someone's heart, is it? To talk love, a whisper can be the better way to go. Today we hear God's whisper.

But first a bitey growl. We go back to June 18; it feels like yesterday, doesn't it? Elijah and the LORD face off against the Ahab and the prophets of Baal. Elijah lays down his challenge. "You set your altar for Baal; I'll set my altar for the LORD. Whoever answers by fire - he is God!" So the prophets of Baal call and dance and cut themselves, but no fire. Elijah calls on the LORD, and the LORD answers with a fire that burned up his offering and the altar and the water Elijah had poured all over it. God's people saw what they needed to see; they heard what they needed to hear; they get off their fence; they bow to the ground and cry: "**The LORD - He is God! The LORD - He is God.**" But Elijah's not done. First, he looks to put the nail in the coffin of Baal worship; he orders the prophets of Baal killed, and the people obey. Then Elijah prays for rain, and God answers. For Elijah, it was win, win, win, and he runs like the wind with the power of the LORD. Wow!

But then what happens? Ahab tells Jezebel what happened, and Jezebel's not one to sit and sulk. She sends a messenger to Elijah with a message of death: "**May the gods deal with me, be**

it ever so severely, if by this time tomorrow I do not make your life like that of the dead prophets of Baal. Elijah was riding high, but now his bubble bursts. Ahab still looked to Jezebel, and Jezebel still had it out for Elijah. Elijah feels crushed. The victory that the LORD had worked didn't matter. The cheer of the people - "the LORD, he is God" - didn't matter. The rain in answer to his prayer didn't matter. Elijah's bubble burst, and so nothing else mattered. He feels like all is lost, and instead of running with the LORD, he runs away in fear, finally ending up at Horeb, the mountain of God, Mount Sinai.

That is where our lesson begins. The LORD asks Elijah, **"What are you doing here?"** Elijah answers, **"I have been very zealous for the LORD God Almighty. The Israelites have rejected your covenant, broken down your altars, and put your prophets to death with the sword. I am the only one left, and now they are trying to kill me."** How did Elijah sound? Feeling a bit sorry for himself, wasn't he? He had worked hard for the LORD, sacrificed years of his life, put his life on the line for the LORD. He had preached and warned and pointed his people to the true God. Elijah figured he had done his part, but he doesn't see the results he thought he should be seeing. Sure, Elijah had done his part, but it seems he doesn't remember any of the good God had done or see any of the good God was doing. Instead, all he saw was what was going wrong. The people wrong; Ahab and Jezebel wrong. God wrong. God wrong for not working the results, for not giving Elijah the results that Elijah thought he should be seeing. Elijah seems to be saying: "God, I've done my part. What about you doing your part? How long are you going to let them get away with what they're

doing?” Elijah wanted results. He expected that by this time God would have stepped in and “made some changes.”

Sound familiar? I think we’ve all been there, haven’t we?

The LORD answered: **“Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the LORD, for the LORD is about to pass by.”** Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains apart and shattered the rocks before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake came a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire. And after the fire came a gentle whisper. When Elijah heard it, he pulled his cloak over his face and went out and stood at the mouth of the cave.”

Wind, earthquakes, and fire are all tools in God’s toolbox, weapons God can use to make changes and get results. And he uses them - to get our attention, to test faith, to judge unbelief, to show that we live in a world of sin and death. Make no mistake, God can and does use windstorms, earthquakes, and fire. But to warm cold hearts, to make dead hearts alive, to bring peace to troubled hearts, what does God use? What is God’s tool to create faith and love? **God’s Gentle Whisper.**

What is that gentle whisper? You’ve heard it. It’s the whisper of God’s love -- the gospel. When we feel all alone, God whispers in his word, “I’m here for you.” When we feel guilty, he whispers in his word, “I forgive you.” When we feel worthless, he whispers in baptism: “You are my son, my daughter

whom I love, with you I am well-pleased.” When we feel hopeless, he whispers, “Think Easter - Jesus is alive and because he lives you will live.” When we feel at the end of our rope, he whispers, “Don’t give up; my promise is true. Don’t give up; my heaven is for you.” God’s whisper is full of promise; God’s whisper is full of Jesus. **“God so loved the world, that he sent his only and only son. Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. The gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus.”** That whisper is God’s power to change hearts; it’s God’s gospel power to save.

But sometimes we forget that. Sometimes we are like Elijah. We tell, we teach, we warn, we scold, we invite to church, and we want to see results. And when we don’t see the results we want, we might feel like giving up -- like Elijah. And maybe, like Elijah, we might wish God would send some sign or give a kick - to make people pay attention, to make people obey, to make people believe.

Then we need to remember God’s lesson for Elijah. **The Gentle Whisper** of the Gospel. **The Gentle Whisper** that changed our heart is God’s power to change other hearts. **The Gentle Whisper** of the gospel that saved us is God’s power to save others.

Remember that whisper in your family. Some days it might seem that you teach and warn and scold all day long and it doesn’t seem to do any good. On those days, it can be tempting to take the easy way out, to rely on fire and thunder and ice to line the family back into shape. Fire and thunder might get

attention, but the gentle whisper of the gospel is what changes hearts. So, yes, there might be times to thunder and scold, but don't forget the gentle whisper of God's love. Scolding, grounding, punishing can teach the consequences of sin; they can help teach children to stay out of trouble. But only the gentle whisper of God's love can change cold hearts to love. Only the gentle whisper of God's love can make rebellious hearts want to obey and want to listen and want to love. Only the gentle whisper of God can make fearful hearts into trusting, giving hearts.

Remember that when you look at the sin and unbelief in our society. What do we do about our world cheering abortion and homosexuality? What do we do about our world cheering sin? We could go to war and meet protest with protest. But what would that accomplish? More hate. We could spend our time and energy trying to write new laws. But what would that accomplish? Would that really accomplish our goals? It might curb some sins; it might curb some hearts from doing this wrong or that wrong, but would it change hearts from being wrong? The only real and lasting way to fight the sins of society is to change hearts. Laws can't and laws won't change hearts; the only way to change hearts is with the gentle whisper of the gospel.

Remember that for yourselves. When we wish that God would take action and strike down the sinner, remember we have been that sinner. God's ripping wind; his earth-shaking anger; his burning fire - that's what we all deserve. It's what we deserve for being like the Israelites following the ways of the world

instead of the ways of God. It's what we deserve for being like Elijah, giving up on God's Word and feeling sorry for ourselves because God doesn't do things the way we want.

But God still comes to us with his gentle whisper - whispering, "Your sins are forgiven." Whispering, "I will never quit on you; I will never leave you." Whispering with a smile on his face, "I still love you."

God gave Elijah his gentle whisper. Then he sent Elijah back to work. But first he told him, "**I reserve seven thousand in Israel -- all whose knees have not bowed down to Baal and all whose mouths have not kissed him.**" Elijah had wanted to see results. And God had worked his results. We want to see results when we tell and teach and invite to church. And God will work his results. If we get to see them, great - thank God. If we don't get to see them, we don't need to do a scowling Elijah. We can know this - just as God did his work in Elijah's day, God will work his saving work today. And God will get his results.

So whisper. Whisper God's whisper of love and forgiveness. Whisper God's whisper of peace and hope. Whisper God's whisper and you can be sure God will whisper and work right there with you. Amen.



FIRST READING

1 Kings 19:1–19

Now Ahab told Jezebel everything Elijah had done and how he had killed all the prophets with the sword. So Jezebel sent a messenger to Elijah to say, “May the gods deal with me, be it ever so severely, if by this time tomorrow I do not make your life like that of one of them.”

Elijah was afraid and ran for his life. When he came to Beersheba in Judah, he left his servant there, while he himself went a day’s journey into the wilderness. He came to a broom bush, sat down under it and prayed that he might die. “I have had enough, LORD,” he said. “Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors.” Then he lay down under the bush and fell asleep.

All at once an angel touched him and said, “Get up and eat.” He looked around, and there by his head was some bread baked over hot coals, and a jar of water. He ate and drank and then lay down again.

The angel of the LORD came back a second time and touched him and said, “Get up and eat, for the journey is too much for you.” So he got up and ate and drank. Strengthened by that food, he traveled forty days and forty nights until he reached Horeb, the mountain of God. There he went into a cave and spent the night.

And the word of the LORD came to him: “What are you doing here, Elijah?”

So Elijah went from there and found Elisha son of Shaphat. He was plowing with twelve yoke of oxen, and he himself was driving the twelfth pair. Elijah went up to him and threw his cloak around him.
