How was your 2024? Was it a year of glory, peace, and joy? A year you would like to live over and over again? Or was 2024 a year that crashed and burned - a year you never want to live over, a year you want to forget? Or someplace in between? I imagine, for most of us, it was all the above. Some days great, some days awful, and some days in-between.

I'm hoping for better in 2025. Better than crash and burn, better than in-between. I'm hoping for better. Not just better health, not just better, more fun. I'm wanting to be better. To be more purposeful. To be more useful. To be smarter, wiser. To be kinder, gentler, more patient. To be stronger, more insistent and persistent. To be more godly. To be better.

That could sound so like Peter - "Make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, love. For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being [useless] in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." "This year I want to be better" - that can sound like Peter. Or it can sound like New Year's blather - blah, blah, blah - "This year I resolve to be better, blah, blah, blah."

Which will it be? I could dip and drown us in Ecclesiastes - "there is nothing new under the sun": no matter what I do, under the sun, my life will splat. I could leave you there in

Ecclesiastes. Or I can baptize you as the new you God is promising that you are. I almost said, "I can baptize you to be the new you God is making you to be." That would be true, but God has better for us than "he is making us to be new." God is already promising us, me and you, that "you are new." And that's the way I get to think and live; that's the way you get to think and live - like we are new. Why? Because God has made us new.

Why? It's not because we've done such a great job of thinking and living new in the past. Paul writes: "At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another." Time and again that was me in 2024. And my 2024 crash and burn days, so many of them can be directly related to my sin and guilt days. So many, but not all. Some of my crash and burn days are just because God loves me; he knows what I need. But even though I have crashed and burned so many times, even though I have taken my eyes and ears off Jesus and his Word and have steered myself toward sin and hell, that's right, even though I have steered myself into crashing and burning, what has our God done for me, for us? "He saved us." Why? Not because we steered ourselves back to him. Not because we put the brake on our sin. Not because of righteous things we have done, not because of the good we have done, but he saved us because of his great mercy.

He saved us. Don't you love the "d" at the end of that word "saved"? Paul doesn't just say that God will save us or might save us or will save us if, if, if .... No, Paul says that God

saved us. How? Paul could take us to the cross, like he did just verses earlier, pointing to Jesus "who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good." That's cross-talk - Jesus gave himself, he paid the price to set us free from all wickedness; he gave himself, shedding his blood to purify us to be his own people. You get to see yourself set free from sin and washed clean for God. Why? Because Jesus gave himself for you - that's cross-talk.

But now in our lesson, when Paul explains how God saved us, Paul doesn't take us to the cross (he's already done that); instead Paul points us to Jesus and takes us to our baptism. God saved us with a washing, not just a washing away of our sin, but a washing of rebirth, a washing that makes us born again. You know how you step into the shower feeling dirty and tired and old, and then step out of the shower feeling clean and new? Baptism is so much more than that. In baptism, we don't just have water washing us clean, soothing us, invigorating us. In baptism, we have the Holy Spirit of God at work - washing us, soothing us, invigorating us. In baptism, we have the Spirit of God making us new.

In baptism, through water and the Word - "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" you have the Promise of the Father's love, the Promise of Jesus' death and resurrection, the Promise of the Holy Spirit - all applied to you. Through water and the Word, we are loved by God, washed clean and spotless for God, made alive with God as the children of God.

That's sounds so good, doesn't it? Clean and spotless, alive and new as the children of God! But Paul doesn't stop there. Paul can't stop there. I need more. Paul can tell me I'm alive and new, but in my heart and my head, it's too easy for me to see and hear my old self and what my old self has going here and now. And what my old self has going here and now isn't clean or right. So what does Paul do? He points me away from myself; he points me away from my here and now. He points us to Jesus and what Jesus did for us long ago, and then he points us to heaven. I'm not just washed and made new; in Jesus, we are justified by God's grace. This is a done deal - in God's courtroom, God has declared you to be right, right by him and right for heaven. And that's not all. This is a done deal - God has written you into his will to be an heir of eternal life.

The blessings of baptism aren't just a one-day truth, only true on the day you are baptized. The blessings of baptism aren't just a "while the water is wet" truth, only true for as long as the water is still wet on you, or as long as you live clean and think clean. No, Paul doesn't talk about your new birth and new life as a past and gone truth. Paul talks about your new birth and new life as a past, present, and future truth. On Sunday, March 24, 1963, I was washed clean for God; that means on every day, I am washed clean for God. On Sunday, March 24, 1963, I was made new and alive with God; that means on every day I am reborn, every day made new and alive with God. On Sunday, March 24, 1963, I was declared to be an heir of eternal life; that means on every day I am declared to be an heir of eternal life. That's not just a Kevin Raddatz truth; that's God's truth. God's truth for me and God's truth for you. On the day you were baptized, and

every day after, you have God calling you clean, God calling you new, God calling you his forever.

I don't always feel that way. I don't always think or act that way. Here's a neat thing about God's truth. My feeling, my thinking, doesn't determine God's truth. God's Truth is true no matter how I think or feel. So now I have a choice. Every morning I have a choice. Every moment I have a choice. Do I go with my old thinking, my old feeling, my old way of living? Or do I think and live according to God's Truth - I am washed and clean, new and alive with God - today and forever!

It's so easy to go back to the old, so easy to go with our feeling and thinking. So Paul doesn't stop. Instead he passes the baton. "This is a trustworthy saying. And I want you to stress these things, so that those who have trusted in God may be careful to devote themselves to doing what is good. These things are excellent and profitable for everyone." With an exclamation point - "this is a trustworthy saying," Paul passes the baton to Titus - "I want you to stress these things." And the Holy Spirit passes the baton to us: "This is a trustworthy saying. And I want you to stress these things."

Why? Not just so we can feel better about ourselves. But so this year and this day we can live better for God and better for each other.

How will you stress these things for your self? How will you pass the baton for those around you? That's what we're talking about in Family Bible Hour today. Amen.







Hear us, Lord, as we pray in silence.


