How do you raise a child to be strong? We start with hugs and kisses. Why? We want our babies to know they're loved and safe and special. Then we play "so big." We want our babies to stretch into strong. And when they start walking, then what? We hold out our arms and smile. Then when junior takes a step toward us, we step back. We want our toddlers to stretch some more - "I'm safe; I'm loved; and I can do this." Then we get the book out, the good book: *The Little Engine That Could*. We read how that little engine pulled the big train up the mountain: "I think I can; I think I can; I think I can." We teach our little ones to think big. Just because something looks hard doesn't mean we can't. Just because something is hard doesn't mean we have to give up. We get to live life can-do strong.

Then at some point we hear voices. Voices that say: "Just do it!" Voices that say: "You can do whatever you want." And when we hear those voices, there's a part of us that says: "Amen. It's my life. I can do whatever I want." We might not be pottytrained, we might not be able to keep ourselves clean and dry, we might not be able to walk or say much more than "momma" and "dadda" and "no," but there's a part of us that thinks "I can do whatever I want." And as mommas and daddas and teachers and pastors, we're not sure whether to laugh or cry. Why would we cry? Because we know that our children are in for a life-time of fighting. Just as we are. Fighting within our self; fighting with the world, fighting with God. Part of us demanding, with the

world cheering us on: "I can do whatever I want." Part of us crying or cringing (with the world piling on): "Why can't I get anything right?" And then there's that fight with God. We say: "It's my life; I can do what I want." And God says: "No, you can't." From Mt. Sinai, thundering and shaking, God lays down his Law: "Thou shalt not." And in our every day lives, as colds and cancer knock us down, as age and arthritis slow us down, as our simple bone-headedness trips us up, God keeps insisting: "No, you can't do whatever you want."

"No, you can't do whatever you want." Why does God keep pounding that into me? Doesn't he want me to be strong? Yes. And he wants you to be strong. Not just today. And not just for a day. Not just chugging up this mountain or that. Not just strong to get our way here and now. No, God wants us to be strong, and safe. God doesn't want us lost to the lies of Satan: "You can do whatever you want." He doesn't want us lost to hell. But God wants you to be strong with him, strong in the forever and ever joy of heaven. The God who created this world with the Word of Jesus ... the Jesus who walked on water ... the Jesus who healed the sick and raised the dead - He wants you to know that you have can-do power with him. He wants you to be able to say: "I can do everything through him who gives me strength." Or better - "I am strong for anything through Christ who makes me strong."

Christ is able to make us strong for anything. So why is math and memory work so hard? Or here's a tougher question. I find myself asking this question myself: "If God is all-powerful (and I know he is), and he wants me to have life with him (and that's what he says), then why is life so hard? Why doesn't God make life easier? Why doesn't God make me stronger so that life isn't so hard?" And the question isn't just: "Why is life so hard with sickness and trouble?" I also want to know: "Why is it so hard to be a Christian?" If God is all-powerful and he can make me strong, why doesn't he just make me strong?

That can be a tough one. So why? God doesn't want me thinking with the devil: "I can do whatever I want." God doesn't want me thinking with the world that I make myself strong. Thinking like that is a sure way to hurt, heartache, and hell. Instead, God wants me to think this way every day - Jesus makes me strong. I need Jesus to make me strong. I have Jesus to make me strong. I need Jesus to make me strong. I have Jesus to make me strong. I have Jesus to make me strong when I want to give up on my math and memory work. I have Jesus to make me strong when I want to give up on life. I have Jesus to make me strong when I want to give up on God. I have Jesus to make me strong. You have Jesus to make you strong.

How does Jesus make us strong? Math! Or at least addition and subtraction. Jesus takes away the guilt that cuts us off from God's power. He takes away the guilt that weakens us, tears us up, that makes us feel small. Whenever we feel that sin and guilt are overpowering us - "Why can't I get anything right? Why should I even bother?" - we get to remember - Jesus took our sin and guilt as his own and he paid for it at the cross. I don't have to carry it; we don't need to be kicking ourselves and beating ourselves up. And we don't need to live in fear of God, holding back from God, waiting for God to judge us. We don't have to live in fear of God judging us wrong because Jesus has taken our wrong away. That's the subtraction.

And here's the addition. In baptism, God adds Jesus to you and your life. In baptism, God covers you with Jesus. Covered with Jesus, God sees you right by him. With Jesus, God sees you as someone special - as family together with him - as someone he wants to back up, hold up, power up. What does that mean for us? With Jesus, you have God working his power for you; and you have God in you to work his power in you.


Some days I wish he'd work his power in me with a snap of his fingers. Just like that I'd be strong for whatever comes my way. Jesus has a different way to make us strong with his strength. Do you remember how we help little children to be strong to walk? We walk with them and hold their hand. We set down in front of them with a smile on our face and our arms stretched out. That's what Jesus does for us. He walks with us and holds us. He holds his promise out in front of us - "**you know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him**" - and as we reach for his promise, he makes us strong. Strong to say: "I can do whatever I want"? No, strong in a far, far better way, strong to say: "I can do all things ... I am strong for all things through him who gives me strength." Amen.


GATHERING RITE ON THE WORD OF GOD




