Did you see the news this past week? The Gaza Strip. Last weekend, hundreds, maybe thousands of terrorists killing and kidnaping hundreds of unsuspecting civilians. And now a week of bombing and shelling, for some a week of payback, for some a week of defending, trying to crush the enemy. I won't get into the politics. If I were an Israeli, I'm pretty sure I'd want to crush the enemy I see attacking my people; if I were a Palestinian, I'm pretty sure I'd want to break out against the enemy I see crushing my people. I won't ask if you saw the bodies. I'll ask if you saw the hearts. What did you see? Anger or fear? Hatred or hurt? Sacrifice or selfishness? Sometimes, it's hard to tell the difference. Put them all together - hurt and fear, anger and hatred, hopelessness and selfishness - what do we get? Another part of the world shaking - shaking in anger, shaking in fear, shaking with hurt, another part of the world now shaking with explosions.

It's not just over there, is it? We are a world at war in so many places, places we hardly ever see in the headlines. And we are a world at war in so many ways - selfishness and hopelessness, stoked by fear and anger, stoked by hurt and hatred, all mixing together in ugly, ugly ways. Not just far away, but close to home. Not just far away, but in our homes. Not just far away, but in our hearts. We might try to bottle it up inside ourselves; we definitely try to bottle their hurt, their fear, their

anger up inside them. But what happens? The bottled-up implode and explode in some really ugly ways.

We see it in our lesson. The people of Samaria are bottled up, surrounded, besieged by a Syrian army. Starving. How hungry would you have to be eat a donkey's head? How hungry would you have to be to pay \$700 for a starved, emaciated donkey's head? How hungry would you have to be to pay \$50 for a cup of what? We don't know - was it bird poop or some awful tasting plant? How hungry and how desperate would you have to be to boil your baby to eat? Self-preservation stoked by hopelessness can show itself in some ugly, awful ways.

Did you notice where Elisha was? God wasn't keeping Elisha safe and comfortable on the other side of the fence. No, God had Elisha right there in the middle of the ugly hopelessness. Did you notice how Elisha was? He had it together. I think of this year's school theme verse - "I am strong for all things through Christ who gives me strength." Elisha had it together. We might think: "Of course! Elisha knew the future. That's how he could hold it together." Well, yes, Elisha did know the future, for some people, a future impossible to believe. Let's think about that. Do you know anyone else who knows the future in this ugly, awful, hurting, hating, fearful, angry world? Do you know anybody here who knows the future? We do. We know the future God has in store for us! It's how we keep it together while the world around us is angry and hating. It's how we keep it together while the world around us is bottled up, imploding and exploding. We know the future God has in store for us!

What did Elisha know? In a bottled-up city, where people were paying \$700 for scrawny donkey head and \$50 for a cup of ick, in a bottled-up city where people were eating their children, Elisha knew this - the next day, 12 pounds of fine wheat flour could be had for less than \$8, a pound for less than 75 cents. That's cheaper than Crusteaz at Costco. Who could believe that? Only someone blessed to believe in God.

I haven't gotten to the best part of the story yet. Four guys with leprosy are at the city gate. I imagine they're at the gate because outside is the Syrian army bottling them up, and inside the gates their neighbors want nothing to do with them; inside the gates their neighbors want them out of there. With nowhere to go, they're at the gates trying to figure out their future. If they go into the city, they starve. If they stay where they are, they starve. That leaves going over to the Syrians. They figure, "What do we have to lose? We'll go over to the Syrians and see if they spare us." And what do they find? The Syrian army gone. They, the Syrians, had heard what they thought was the sound of an army coming against them, so they took off with not much more than the clothes on their backs, leaving behind most everything they had. Food and drink, silver and gold, clothes and tents, donkeys and horses - all left behind, all right there for those four outcasts to take what they wanted for themselves.

For themselves. Starved by the Syrians outside the gates, treated like lepers by their own people inside the gates, it could have been so easy for those four guys to think of nothing and no one but for themselves. Left to fend for themselves, it would have been so easy to let their neighbors back in Samaria fend for

themselves. But even with all that had been done to them, that's not what they did. Instead, they get to talking with each other: "We're not doing right. This is a day of good news and we are keeping it to ourselves. If we wait until daylight, punishment will overtake us. Let's go at once and report this to the royal palace."

We might wish we heard more love and less fear in their words. So be it. Let's hear what they said again: "We're not doing right. This is a day of good news and we are keeping it to ourselves."

Back inside the city gates, apart from Elisha and who knows how many, they didn't think it was a day of good news. Back inside the city gates, they were still living a life of hurt and heartache, a life of anger and hatred, a life of fear and fighting, a life of death and dying. They didn't know the truth of what God had for them - release and relief for the bottled up, life-giving food for those starving to death, healing for the hurting, peace for the angry, peace for the fearing, a new life for the dying. Inside the gates, they didn't know the truth, the good news of what God had for them. But those four, they knew. And they couldn't keep it to themselves.

We live in a world of hurt and heartbreak, anger and hatred, fear and fighting, a world of people bottled-up imploding and exploding. We know it; we feel it, don't we? But we also know something else, someone else. We know we have a God who would have every right to be hurt and angry. Whether it's the way we cannibalize each other's spirits when we're hurting and

afraid, whether it's the ways we blow up on God blaming him for our wrong, God would have every right to be exploding against us. I won't say that he's not hurt or angry, but today, here and now, instead of exploding against us, he's giving us the opportunity for a new life with Jesus. We don't have to live a life of fear and guilt bottling up inside us. We don't have to live a life of hurt with no healing or hope. We don't have to live a life of fighting, imploding and exploding.

God is offering us a new life with Jesus, and Jesus has heaven for us. In heaven, think about it - there will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain for the old order of things - the ways things work in this world - will have passed away. With Jesus, we get to live a life of hope! With Jesus, we have a better day coming, we have a better life coming. And hope takes the pressure off, doesn't it?

But it's not just the hope of heaven that takes the pressure off. When we hurt, when we're stressed and anxious, worried and afraid, when we're angry because we're hurt and stressed and anxious and worried and afraid, we know what it's like to implode and explode and cannibalize each other's spirits, don't we? It's ugly and painful to everyone around. And I imagine you know what's it's like to try to bottle it up. Sooner or later, it all lets loose in ugly and painful ways.

Well, we don't have to live a life of letting it loose; we don't have to live a life of bottling it up. We don't have to live a life of fear and guilt, on edge, wondering when God will be fed up and done with us. Look at the cross. The Jesus who offers

you heaven, he doesn't just know what it's like to face the ugly worst of this world, Jesus took for you and for me and for that whole world out there, Jesus took on himself, not just the worst of this world, but the anger and judgment of God. We don't need to live with bottled up fear and guilt.

Listen to Jesus on Good Friday: "It is finished." See what your Father has for you with Easter: Jesus lives! And in your baptisms, his life is your life - with Jesus, you get to live right with God, with God for you - today and forever! So, listen to his Spirit, the Spirit of Jesus, the Spirit of your Father: "Peace - I've got you! Peace - I love you; I forgive you! Peace - I've got you and your heart and your every need covered." Listen tot he Spirit speaking inside you: "The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want. ... Even though I walk through the valley of death, I will fear no evil. ... surely goodness and mercy will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever."

It's so good to hear that, isn't it? That's the Good News we have; the Good News so many around us don't have. When those four saw and tasted and had their fill of all that God had for them, they knew what to do with the Good News, didn't they? They couldn't just it to themselves; they had to share it. And so do we! Amen.

Now Elisha was sitting in his house, and the elders were sitting with him. The king sent a messenger ahead, but before he arrived, Elisha said to the elders, "Don't you see how this murderer is sending someone to cut off my head?

Look, when the messenger comes, shut the door and hold it shut against him. Is not the sound of his master's footsteps behind him?" While he was still talking to them, the messenger came down to him.

The king said, "This disaster is from the LORD. Why should I wait for the LORD any longer?"

Elisha replied, "Hear the word of the LORD. This is what the LORD says: About this time tomorrow, a seah of the finest flour will sell for a shekel and two seahs of barley for a shekel at the gate of Samaria."

The officer on whose arm the king was leaning said to the man of God, "Look, even if the LORD should open the floodgates of the heavens, could this happen?"

"You will see it with your own eyes," answered Elisha, "but you will not eat any of it!"

So they got up and fled in the dusk and abandoned their tents and their horses and donkeys. They left the camp as it was and ran for their lives.

The men who had leprosy reached the edge of the camp, entered one of the tents and ate and drank. Then they took silver, gold and clothes, and went off and hid them. They returned and entered another tent and took some things from it and hid them also.

Then they said to each other, "What we're doing is not right. This is a day of good news and we are keeping it to ourselves. If we wait until daylight, punishment will overtake us. Let's go at once and report this to the royal palace."


