Sermon followed by Service – October 20, 2024 – 1 Peter 1:1-9

Helene. Milton. Did you see what those hurricanes did? They didn't just gray the sky and pour down rain, did they? They tore trees and houses apart, tossed cars, washed away roads, left towns and cities and countless lives in ruins. Now what? So many need more than a new car, more than a new house. So many need a whole New Start.

Peter wrote to people who needed a New Start. Not in the same way. Peter's people hadn't lost their homes and jobs, their way of life; they hadn't lost most everything they had to torrents and floods of water. Instead they were in danger of losing their hearts and souls to floods of distraction and spiritual depression. The distraction and depression that can come from always feeling out of place, always feeling outnumbered and alone. The distraction and depression that can come from always being on the wrong side of fair, the wrong side of being treated right. The distraction and depression that can come from always feeling on edge - "Now what? What's going to happen next?" When a heart and soul is feeling out of place, outnumbered, alone, it can be so tempting to want to fit in, no matter how wrong fitting in would be. When a heart is feeling mistreated, wronged, it can be so tempting to want to do wrong to those who did us wrong. When a soul is feeling hopeless and pointless, it can be so easy to give up.

As Christians, Peter's people were outnumbered; because they lived as Christians, they were strangers to the world around them, and treated that way. In so many ways, it seemed the world was against them. And so it was tempting, tempting to fit in with the world, tempting to put God off to the side, tempting to be distracted from

who they were and why they were. Tempting and tiring. Peter's people needed a New Start.

Sound familiar? As a Christian in an unChristian world, as a Christian in a world that doesn't think like Christ, as a Christian in a world with a whole different set of priorities than Jesus Christ, do you ever feel outnumbered and out-of-place? Like a stranger who doesn't fit in? It's tiring, isn't it? Tiring to be different. Tiring to have to constantly fight not to get sucked in and sucked down into living the life of the world. Tiring and dangerously distracting. I see it in our St. John family - FOMO - the Fear Of Missing Out on what the world has. So I see in our St. John family a destructive distraction at work. Hearts and souls distracted by the world, more and more living the life of the world. Hearts and souls distracted by their hurt, more and more cocooning apart from Jesus, more and more wrapping themselves up in themselves. I see it more and more in our St. John family - hearts and souls distracted from our purpose as God's people, more and more of us thinking our purpose in life is to live the life of the world, to live to satisfy self. It wasn't just Peter's people who could use a New Start, we could use a New Start.

Where do you see this true in your life?
In what ways do you need a New Start with God?
In what ways do you see St. John needing a New Start with God?

What is Peter's way ... what is God's way to give us his New Start? God could give us a new start like he gave Jerusalem a new start with Nebuchadnezzar - God could use the world we love to crush us into starting new. Or God could give us a new start like he did with Noah and the flood - God could wipe out and wipe away every

distraction around us. Or God could do like he has done so many times before - I think of Israel wandering in the wilderness for 40 years, an entire generation dropping dead in the desert, never making it to the Promised Land; I think of the northern Ten Tribes of Israel sent away by God never to return - God could just simply say: "I've given you so many new starts, and what do you do? You keep on going back to your old ways. No more."

With the way that I waste and squander the New Starts God offers, I've given God so many reasons to send me away, so many reasons to let me just drift away into the world. As a congregation, with what we've done with the New Starts God has given us, what? We've given God good reason to let us just drift off. With the ways we - one by one and together - have wasted and squandered God's New Starts, we deserve to have God send us off, to have God let us drift off to live the life that ends in hell.

But God didn't write Peter's people off, and I pray he hasn't written us off. He didn't give Peter's people a New Start the hard shake way - "You better start new or else" - and I pray that we don't need a hard shake. Instead Jesus offers our tired and distracted hearts a New Start - how? With a promise - "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade—kept in heaven for you...."

Instead of writing us off, God is giving us a New Start - a new birth into a living hope. We get to start new and live new! Instead of living as strangers and outsiders, out of place and put off by the world, we get to live chosen and called by God to be his with him. Instead of living the FOMO life, with our eye always on the world, always

wanting what the world has, living in fear of missing out on what the world has, we get to live like we have something far better. Instead of living with our hearts and minds stuck on the life of the world, we get to live with our hearts and minds looking beyond this world. We have an inheritance in heaven - an inheritance far better than anything our neighbors are chasing.

What does that mean for us? We don't have to live distracted wanting what the world has. We don't have to live depressed because we don't have what the world has. We don't have to live like we're missing out. We have an inheritance that won't ever perish, spoil, or fade, an inheritance that won't ever fall apart, get hurricaned, or spent away. We get to look forward to a life in paradise, a life where the streets are paved with gold, a life where our bodies will feel alive and new every morning and night, where our hearts will never hurt, a forever life of "wow!" and "ah!" And that's the way we get to live - like we have been chosen by God for heaven.

There's something I need to make clear here. I'm not just singing sunshine on a rainy day. I'm not just re-framing cracked eggs into an omelet, or lemons into lemonade. Our new birth isn't just a new and positive way of thinking. Our living hope isn't just a feeling that something better is coming our way. No, our new birth into a living hope is through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. Our new birth comes with Easter power and Easter promise.

What does Easter mean for us? Think of the cross and the empty tomb. Why was Jesus on that cross? The easy answer is to point to the evil out there in the world - "it's their fault." Here's the hard answer. It was God's will, the Father's will to have Jesus on that cross and to crush him there. Why? To have someone pay - because someone had to pay - for the way we have squandered our new starts.

Instead of making us pay, God put Jesus in our place, and he made Jesus pay. That's Good Friday; so what about Easter? When God raised Jesus back to life, God was making it clear - his judgment is done! That must mean our guilt is done! Our forgiveness is won! Now, instead of living a life of judgment and fear, we get to Start New with hope.

But the devil doesn't want us starting new; the world doesn't want us living new with Jesus. So what? Look to Easter! The devil couldn't stop Jesus from his New Start; the world couldn't stop Jesus from living his New Life. And we don't have to let the devil or the world stop us from our New Start. With our Easter Jesus, it's not the devil that gets his way; it's not the world that gets its way. No, with Easter, Jesus gets his way, and his way means life, life made right for you.

But. But what about all the troubles we have here in this world? We could let our troubles distract us; we could let our troubles depress us. But we don't have to let our troubles distract us or depress us. Your troubles, my troubles, our troubles, that's the stage where God is working to show his love, his power, his way to glory. That means, your troubles, my troubles, our troubles - that's the stage where we get to show - not distraction or depression - but we get to show the love, the power, the victory that God is working for us.

Like Daniel did. Daniel could have been distracted by living the high life, he could have been depressed by his troubles. Daniel could have been distracted and depressed by the lions - who here wouldn't be? Instead, Daniel used his time in the lions' den to show off the awesome greatness of God. That's not my natural instinct. My natural instinct is be distracted. My natural instinct is to feel downed. My natural instinct is to cut myself off. So Peter reminds us of something we already know - we love Jesus; we believe in Jesus; and we are receiving what Jesus has for us - the salvation of our souls.


Don't you love the way Peter says that? In our distractedness, Peter doesn't command us into loving and believing Jesus. He doesn't try to squeeze more loving and believing out of us. In our distractedness, Peter reminds us of what we already know and love - We love Jesus! We believe in Jesus! And we are receiving the goal of our faith, the salvation of our souls. That's the new life, the New Start we get to live. Instead of living beaten down, instead of living distracted, we get to live - we love Jesus, we believe in Jesus, and we are receiving the goal of our faith, the salvation of our souls! Let's live that New Life, that New Start together. Amen.

NICENE CREED
