Dogs drink from the toilet bowl. Birds drink their stinky bath water. Cats drink the sweet poison puddled underneath your car. What would you be willing to drink to quench your thirst? I imagine a good many of us have tried to quench our thirst in ways more disgusting than the toilet bowl, that we have tried to satisfy ourselves in ways more toxic than a puddle of poison. But we don't have to go to the sewer to quench our thirst. We don't have to poison ourselves to find satisfaction. Our lesson offers us a better thirst-quencher, the real thirst-quencher - Come! Listen! Quench Your Thirst with Jesus!

So what do you thirst for? When Isaiah says: "Come, all you who are thirsty" he isn't talking about a dry mouth, a parched throat, a physical thirst. A glass of water can take care of that. But what do you thirst for inside? ... in your heart and soul? Sitting around you are people who thirst for love, who deep down wish they could feel accepted for who they are, people who wish they could look good on the outside and feel good about themselves on the inside. Sitting around you are people who thirst for praise, to be seen as good, smart, strong, as right. People around you are thirsting to matter, to be appreciated. People sitting around you are thirsting for peace, a world made right. Some are thirsting for hope, some reason to think a better life is coming. So, what do you thirst for on the inside?

And what's the answer for that thirst? First, to appreciate the answer for our thirst we need to know - Why are we so thirsty

on the inside? Our thirst on the inside goes back to our core at creation. God created us to be constantly fed and watered with God's love and rightness. God created us to live in a world of perfect peace. In the beginning, God created us to walk and talk with God, to live in his love. God created our human race in his image, right in every way. Living in God's rightness, we would be in perfect peace and harmony with God and the world. That's the way life was supposed to be for us. But we thought we could do better for ourselves. Now guilt, shame, failure eat at our core. Now our love is tainted, twisted, dry and no amount of tainted, twisted love can satisfy our heart. And so we thirst - we thirst for rightness and approval; we thirst for love and acceptance. We thirst for peace and hope.

So we try to quench our thirst. We might think that having a family will quench our thirst - find the right spouse, have the right number of kids, and our thirst for love will be quenched. Instead, we find the hurt of family life makes us all the more thirsty. To quench that thirst we might bury ourselves in our work, our job, our family duties - if I just do enough, if I just keep everybody happy, maybe then I'll be loved; maybe then I'll be accepted. Doesn't work, does it? So we might try to demand love, but demanded love soon turns sour. We might try ripping and ragging on everything that is wrong in our world, so people see us as smart and we can feel good about ourselves. But people who try that, they're never satisfied, are they?

So perhaps we turn to the pain-killers. Some try to drink the pain away. Some try to eat their empty heart full. Some think a pill, a puff, a push will make things right - but one or once is never enough. Some try to escape life by hiding in front of a screen; some look for a new or a pretend life in front of their screens. But none of it works, does it?

Isaiah knew that. He asked, "Why spend money on what is not bread, and your labor on what does not satisfy?" Why do we spend so much time, so much energy, trying to quench our thirst in ways that do not and can not fill the emptiness inside? Why? Isaiah isn't looking for an answer from us. He wants to give God's answer to us.

God invites us, "Listen, listen to me, and eat what is good, and your soul will delight in the richest of fare. Give ear and come to me; hear me, that your soul may live." God isn't just offering a drink of water or a crust of bread, he is offering a banquet of blessing! He isn't just offering a smile of love or a word of approval, he is offering life! Life the way it's supposed to be! Life right in God's love! Life right with God's approval! A life of peace and harmony in every good way!

Listen to God's invitation: "Give ear and come to me; hear me, that your soul may live. I will make an everlasting covenant with you, my faithful love promised to David." About 300 years earlier God had promised David that the Savior, God's promised, perfect King, would be born into David's family.

This was no secret to Isaiah's people. Isaiah had told them: "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father,

Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever." Isaiah is telling us, that promise, that Prince of Peace, that Lord and Savior - and all his blessing - is for you!

How does that quench our thirst? We thirst for love because in our sin we lost God's love. We thirst for approval because in our sin we lost God's approval. But with his death on the cross, Jesus took our sin away. With his perfect life Jesus won for us God's approval. Now, as God's witness, Jesus calls you back to God's love. Now, as God's witness, Jesus announces to you God's peace and approval. With Jesus you have what your heart was missing - God's love, God's peace, God's promise for life made right.

But there are still times we feel mighty thirsty inside, aren't there? Before you give up on Jesus, listen to what God says: "Come, all you who are thirsty; listen to me; hear me, so that your soul may live." Listen to Jesus deep inside. When your soul is thirsting for love, listen to Jesus: "My body for you; my blood for you; my life and my everything for you." When your soul is parched with shame, thirsting for rightness, "Why can't I get things right?" listen for Jesus: "There is now no condemnation for those in Christ Jesus." When your insides need to know that life will get better, listen for Jesus: "You know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him." What makes your soul thirst? Listen to Jesus deep inside. He has what it takes to quench your thirst.

With Jesus, the day is coming when you will never thirst again.

In heaven you will see God face to face. There you will experience life and love made right, life and love the way it's supposed to be. In the meantime, we still have our thirsty days. On those days, check where you are drinking. Check where you look for satisfaction. Don't settle for the toilet water this world offers. Instead accept God's invitation -- Come! Listen! And Quench Your Thirst with Jesus! Amen.

Let them turn to the LORD, and he will have mercy on them, and to our God, for he will freely pardon.


"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the LORD.

That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat by the lake. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat in it, while all the people stood on the shore. Then he told them many things in parables, saying: "A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root.

Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. Whoever has ears, let them hear."

"Listen then to what the parable of the sower means: When anyone hears the message about the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what was sown in their heart. This is the seed sown along the path. The seed falling on rocky ground refers to someone who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away. The seed falling among the thorns refers to someone who hears the word, but the worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, making it unfruitful. But the seed falling on good soil refers to someone who hears the word and understands it. This is the one who produces a crop, yielding a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown."
