# Sermon followed by Service

November 12, 2023

Matthew 25:1-13

Think with me: What are the scariest verses in the Bible?

- How about: "Greet one another with a holy kiss"?
- A scary verse for teachers, especially Bible teachers: "Not many of you should presume to be teachers, because you know that we who teach will be judged more strictly."
- One for pastors: "I will tell them [false pastors] plainly, 'I never knew you. Away from me, you evildoers!"
- Here is one that got me scolded when I preached on it a few years ago: Ananias and Sapphira. This is a paraphrase: They lie to God, and they die by God.
- I think one of the scariest verses in the Bible has to be in our lesson today. You heard it a few minutes ago. Jesus says: "I don't know you."

"I don't know you." What do you do with that? That's what I wanted to know, so I googled some sermons. The first couple sermons, here's what they did with it: \_\_\_\_\_. That's right, nothing. Just as if Jesus never said it. Worse, with those sermons, it was almost as if Jesus never existed. But that makes sense, doesn't it? When we pretend there is no judgment, who needs a Savior? When we pretend there is no judgment, who needs a Jesus?

But before I get all puffed up for dropping a line on you that some preachers are afraid to say, here's something scary - How often have I lived, how often do I still live like Jesus never said it? - "I don't know you." How often do we get caught up living the life of the world, putting Jesus off to the side, ignoring Jesus, living the life of the world like Jesus would never say to us: "I don't know you"? How often do we stick our heads in the sand and pretend Jesus never said it, or would never say: "I don't know you" to family or friend, to neighbor or co-worker? Scary, isn't it?

Did you notice this about those shut out by Jesus? In the parable, they don't present themselves as enemies of the groom; they present themselves as friends. In the parable, they weren't outsiders; they were part of the "in" crowd. They know who the groom is; they know who Jesus is. But they couldn't be bothered to be ready for Jesus; they couldn't be bothered to make sure they stayed ready for Jesus.

That's scary. The thought of Jesus, that Jesus in our window, looking us in the eye, looking anybody in the eye: "I don't know you." Oh, it stops us up short, sends a shiver up and down our spines, drops a dark cloud over our heads and hearts, doesn't it? Or at least I hope so. Why? I think of David in Psalm 51: "A broken and contrite heart, o God, you will not despise." I think of God speaking to Jonah about wicked, cruel, violent Nineveh. Jonah wanted Nineveh destroyed. Do you remember what God wanted? Grace and mercy: "Should I not be concerned?" Should we not be sad? The thought of Jesus shutting the door on anybody is sad.

"I don't know you." If those words aren't some of the scariest words in the Bible, they are certainly some of the saddest. Not just because of the judgment in those words. Not just because of the hell on the other side of those words. But "I don't know you" has to be some of the saddest words in the Bible because Jesus wants so much to say: "Welcome home!" Jesus doesn't find joy in shutting the door. He wants so much to invite: "Come to me all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest."

When Jesus says: "all you," when he invites, "all you," he doesn't just have all you [in this 10 degree arc] in mind. This is the "all you" Jesus opens his heart for: "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." This is the "all you" Jesus opens his heart for: "Go and make disciples of all nations."

For Jesus, those aren't just words. For Jesus, an open heart isn't just a warm, fuzzy heart sitting in a comfy chair wishing things were different.

No, remember how Jesus opened his arms to bless the children, how he reached out and touched that man with leprosy, how he ate with the sinners, how he forgave the guilty, how he gave hope to the hopeless? Do you see yourself in there? Jesus made a point of inviting those hushed and shushed by others. He made a point of including those put off and pushed off by others. He made a point of inviting and including and offering an open door to those who had shut themselves out by what they had done. Jesus opened his heart and made a point of sharing the peace and the promise of God with those who had no peace or promise.

Not just in words. On the cross, Jesus stretched out his arms and gave his life as the lamb of God to take away the sins of the world. As the Good Shepherd, he gave his life for sheep that were lost and sheep that would stray, for sheep that were already in with him, and for sheep that were still out and on the wrong side. Jesus gave his everything to open the door for everyone and anyone and for you.

For you. Seeing you, not as a stranger, but knowing you as family kept Jesus going to the cross even when so many were shutting their hearts to him. Seeing you with him in heaven kept Jesus going even when God the Father was shutting his heart to him. Seeing you with him, knowing you as his in heaven, kept Jesus going all the way to the cross. Why? So that God can see you and know you with your sins paid for and gone. So that with Jesus, God can see you and call you forgiven. So that with Jesus, God can see you and know you as his people, holy and right by him. Right for life with him in heaven.

Life in heaven. That's the wedding feast in Jesus' parable. A forever celebration. A life where we will never be sad - there will be no death or mourning or crying or pain. A life where we will never be scared of God or anything. A life where we will never feel shut out from God or anyone. A life where we will never do wrong or be wrong; a life where we will never drop the ball or miss out on what God has for us. Instead, we will enjoy life the way it's supposed to be. That's what Jesus has for us, for you, for me, for them.

I don't want to miss out on that. I don't want to hear Jesus say: "I don't know you." I don't want any of you or them to miss out on that. I don't want any of you or them to hear Jesus say: "I don't know you." And neither does Jesus! So what does Jesus say? "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know the day or the hour." "Keep watch. Be ready."

How? You've heard me say "I don't know you" more times than you ever want to hear. Let me share with you his "I know you" promise: "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me. ... My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand." "I know you." That's the promise Jesus has for you. Amen.

### **DIVINE SERVICE II**

IN OUR WORLD TODAY ... so often we wait and wait only to be ignored and treated like we don't exist.

# FIRST READING


# 1 Thessalonians 5:1–11

Now, brothers and sisters, about times and dates we do not need to write to you, for you know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. But you, brothers and sisters, are not in darkness so that this day should surprise you like a thief. You are all children of the light and children of the day. Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing.
