Sermon followed by Service - November 17, 2024 1 Peter 4:7-11

The clock is ticking. Time is about to run out. What do you do? Do you frenzy? "I'm not ready!" Or with the clock running out, do you "take a knee," sit back and relax? When you hear Peter say: "The end of all things is near" - Do you frenzy? Do you sit back ready? Or do you just shrug - "no big deal, whatever."

I should make it clear. When Peter says: "The end of all things is near," that the clock is ticking and time is about to run out, Peter isn't thinking movie time - you show up ten minutes late and you still have to sit through 15 minutes of sales pitch commercials. And Peter isn't thinking modern church time - that missing the first hymn - when God greets us and we greet God and each other - that missing the confession of sins and absolution - our worship hour's first deep, heart-to-heart talk with God - that missing and late is no big deal. No, Peter isn't thinking that late is no big deal. Peter isn't thinking that late is an option. Peter knows what will happen when Jesus returns - those who are ready Jesus will welcome into heaven; those who are not ready will find the door shut between them and heaven. And Peter knows what Jesus will say to those who aren't ready when he returns - "I don't know you." Peter heard it real clear from Jesus himself - you better be ready when Jesus returns, or else "I don't know you."

Peter's people seemed to know that. And Peter's people knew what they could look forward to at "**the end of all things**." Their Father in heaven had an inheritance for them - an inheritance that would never perish, spoil, or fade - an inheritance better than anything we could ever have or get in this world - an inheritance kept for them in heaven.

We know those same things, don't we? That's why we're here! We know this world is set for judgment, for destruction. And we know why - there is no one in this world who measures up to what God wants; instead there is everyone - including me - who undercuts what God wants. But we have been chosen and called to be culled out from the world and sanctified, chosen and called to be set apart from the world, set apart together with God, set apart for life with God in heaven. And we know why we get to have that hope; we know why we have that future reality. It's not because we haven't shrugged at God, or frenzied, or quit on God, or refused to run the play that he's called for us. No, we've done all those things. Instead, the reason we get to look forward to life with God is Jesus. He never shrugged at what God gave him to do. He never got distracted by this and that and then had to frenzy to get ready for God. He never

I almost said that Jesus never took a knee, but Jesus did take a knee in the Garden of Gethsemene, before he was arrested and killed. Jesus took a knee and prayed that he would do what his Father had for him to do; he took a knee and prayed that he would do what needed to be done. And then Jesus did it. He didn't walk off in the middle of God's play. He ran the play God called for him. He subbed in for you and for me, and he went to the cross. He paid for our shrugging and our frenzy and our quiet-quitting; he covered over our shrugging and frenzy and quiet-quitting by living the life God had for him all the way to the finish.

What does that mean for us? Remember Easter! And remember your baptisms! In your baptism, you are covered with Jesus and his life; in your baptism, you are connected to Jesus and his life, his death, his Easter. In your baptism, God sees you as he sees Jesus - right for life with him in heaven.

So why does Peter talk about the clock ticking, time about to run out, "the end of all things is near"? Not to frenzy us - "I've got to get ready." Peter assumes we are already ready, that we've left the sin of our past to walk with Jesus. So Peter's point isn't "The end is coming; get ready!" No, Peter's point is "The end is coming; finish strong!" Don't shrug off the mission and ministry Jesus has for you. Don't let yourself get frenzied by the world around you, distracted from your mission and ministry by the world around you. Don't quiet-quit on the mission and ministry Jesus has for you. And don't take a knee before the clock runs out.

The devil and the world won't be taking a knee before the clock runs out; up until the last moment they will be looking to knock us on our backsides. They won't quiet-quit and let us be. Up until the end, the devil and the world will be working to frenzy us distracted and dizzy with the world so we're of no use to God.

Peter has a better life for us because God has a better life for us. Better than what? Better than living frenzied and distracted. Better than living knocked onto our backsides. Better than living of no use to God. As we heard in worship last week, we get to live as royal priests approved by God. As we heard in Family Bible Hour, we get live as the body of Christ. Think about how wonderful, how empowering that is!

What do you wish Jesus were doing more in this world? We wish there were more love in this world, more truth, don't we? For the hurting hearts around us, we wish there were more healing and hope. For the stressed, for those needing help, we wish there were more helping. For the stressed and confused, we wish there were more Truth and understanding. For the wandering and the lost, we wish there were more finding and guiding. For the yous in the pews, I

wish there were more mes. For the mes, I wish there were more yous. Jesus wants that same thing. God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - wants that same thing. And what is God's favorite way to work those blessings? Not with a snap of the finger that leaves us watching from the sidelines. No, God's favorite way to share his heart and to work his blessings is through you.

That's not just a plan, an idea, that God has like so many of my plans and ideas - limping, gimping, frenzied and fried. That's the plan God is putting before us, before you and me. That's the plan God is powering and working through us, through you and me. And when God gives us his plan, his mission and ministry, he doesn't shrug with resignation: "We'll see what they do with this." No, as God sees what is going on in this world, he isn't shrugging and quiet-quitting. As he looks forward to Judgment Day and heaven, he isn't taking a knee and waiting for the clock to run out. When it comes to this world, when it comes to this church, there is no complacency or quit in God, only a sense of urgency. You hear that urgency in our lesson today - "the end of all things is near." You hear that urgency - "If anyone speaks, he should do it as one speaking the very words of God. If anyone serves, he should do it with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ."

"If anyone speaks, speak as the very words of God" - Peter isn't talking about tone or force; Peter isn't telling us we get to impose our opinions on people as God's Word. Rather, when you speak God's word to forgive, his word of love, his promise of heaven ... when you speak his call to repent, his call to serve - you get to speak as if you are speaking the very words of God. In the same way, when you serve, you get to serve with the power God provides. Again, Peter isn't talking about force. Rather, instead of relying on our own

strength, we get to serve as if God himself is working his power through us, because he is.

So what do we do? We do like Jesus! Sure, with the end of all things near, we could live a distracted frenzy; we could quit because the God-lived life is hard; we could shrug because we think there's nothing we can do; we could take a knee because we think we've got it made. We could, but that kind of complacency has no place in Jesus' heart. So that kind of complacency has no place in Jesus' church. And that kind of complacency has no place in here [the Christian's heart]. Instead, seeing what this world needs, seeing the mission and ministry Jesus has for us, knowing the power and promise God has for us ... when we hear "the end of all things is near," what do we hear? This is no time for complacency; it's time for urgency with Jesus. Amen.

DIVINE SERVICE II

IN OUR WORLD TODAY ... we are surrounded by people, some living in a distracted frenzy, some quitting because things aren't going their way, some taking a knee thinking they have it made. And it's no surprise we see those same attitudes infecting the church, is it?

IN OUR WORSHIP TODAY ... our lessons address the spiritual complacency associated with distracted frenzy, quiet-quitting, and taking a knee too soon. When it comes to putting God's gifts to God's work, God hasn't called us to live a life of complacency, but a life of urgency!
