Sermon followed by Service - November 3, 2024

1 Peter 1:25-2:3; 2 Peter 1:3-11

I am about to shoot my sermon in the tire. Are you ready to hear the air pshhhh? Here it is - Do we have any Minnesota Vikings fans here? Remember the 1970s with the Purple People Eaters? I wanted to play football like Alan Page. Alan Page -All-Pro defensive tackle year after year, NFL Hall of Famer. Alan Page - that's who I wanted to be like. Off-season, I knew better. Off-season, I wanted to be an Airborne Ranger, jumping out of planes and helicopters, taking the battle to the enemy. Then I wanted to be a nuclear physicist, running nuclear submarines, inventing nuclear cars. You know how people say: "You can be whoever you want to be; you can do whatever you want to do"? I don't think there is any diet and exercise program in the world that could grow me into the great white Alan Page, or an Airborne Ranger, or smart enough to be a nuclear physicist. But there is a diet and exercise program that can do better - a diet and exercise program that can have us stronger and wiser than any childhood dream or imagination - a diet and exercise program that can have you participating in the divine nature - a diet and exercise program that can have you living like you have God alive and living in you.

Peter is writing to people who were the perfect candidates for that kind of diet and exercise program. The people Peter was writing to ... so many of them were small in the eyes of the world, treated like nobodies or worse. People who often felt beat down, tired, withered like the grass in my back yard, blown down and

around like my crusty oak leaves. On their own, they didn't have a lot going for them. They were at the mercy of the world around them, thinking that somehow they should fight to get their way, fight to get their say.

Ever feel that way?

Ever feel that way? If not, don't be too quick to leave me; your day is coming and then you'll be like the rest of us. And like the rest of us, we'll all be tempted to make ourselves big, to make ourselves strong, to make ourselves sharp - to get our way, to get our say. And if that doesn't work, like the rest of us, we'll be tempted to find ourselves a champion out in the world, someone who can make us feel big and strong, someone who can make it feel like we can get our way and get our say. And what will we find out? No matter how big and strong we might think we are, no matter how big and strong we might think our champion is - in this world, in this life, we are all like grass.

That's what makes New Starts so hard. We get scorched and blown about. We get distracted and tired. And if we can get past being distracted and past being exhausted, then what? Just when we think we're greening up, what happens? If it's not the lawn mower blade cutting us down to size, it's the cold of winter hibernating us, turning us in on ourselves. New Starts are hard.

That's why Peter calls us to get on his diet and exercise program. I don't know about you, but I don't like that word diet. But the diet Peter has for us isn't a diet of less; it's a diet of better. Peter knows you've had a taste of it, and you know the

taste is good. Sweeter than honey, more energizing than a Lee's apple fritter, more satisfying than a Culver's Double Deluxe, more comforting than Dragon's Milk. Peter knows what tastes good to you ...

- when your stomach is churning with worry and stress and fear
- when your stomach is sick with guilt
- when your insides are empty, so you feel like your whole life is empty.

Peter knows what tastes good - "Taste and see that the Lord is good!" When our insides are sick with guilt," taste and see that the Lord is good. As the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world, Jesus has taken your sin as his own, your guilt as his own; he's take God's judgment against you as his own. It doesn't matter what your insides say; it doesn't matter what anybody else says; in the courtroom of God, you are "not guilty," in the heart of God you are forgiven and right by God And when your stomach is churning with worry and stress - again "Taste and see that the Lord is good." As your Good Shepherd, Jesus has you close to his heart to bless you; he has everything around you under control to bless you. And when you feel empty inside - "What's the point?" - "Taste and see that the Lord is good." As "the Way, the Truth, and the Life," Jesus has a life for you better than being a star or a hero or even a billionaire inventor. You get to participate in the divine nature with God working his work in you and through you.

In the "pure milk of the Word," what is your go-to comfort food, energy food, sweet treat?

I said, "Taste and see that the Lord is good." Peter would have us do more than taste; Peter would have us gulp and gorge: "Crave the pure milk of the word." Like newborn babies, crave the pure milk of the word. Babies aren't content to nurse or eat just once a week, are they? And if they were to eat just once a week, what would we think? "Something's wrong here!" In the same way, if we go days without eating and drinking the milk of God's Word, something's wrong in here [our heart and mind]. If we go days without eating and drinking the milk of God's Word, we're setting ourselves up to be easy prey for the devil. And if we're talking New Starts, if we think we can get by on a taste of God's Word once a week, we're setting ourselves up to sputter and die.

What does it look like to sputter and die? What does it look like to be spiritually weak and sick? It can look like the darkest sins of the world. But it doesn't have to. It can look like the happiest sins of the world. But it doesn't have to. It can look like the hurt, the worry, the stress and fear of the world. But it doesn't have to. It can look like the pride, the "I'm fine by myself" pride of the world. Sputtering and dying without God's word can look like life out there in the world, or sputtering and dying without God's Word can look like me how many times a week when I don't take God's Word and apply it to me.

What are the warning signs in your life that you are sputtering and dying for lack of the "pure milk of the Word"?

We don't have to sputter and die; we don't have to be spiritually weak or sick; and we don't have to settle for spiritual HoHos and Ding Dongs. We have the pure milk of the Word. Here in worship and Bible Study, at home with your Bibles, your devotions, our Forward in Christ magazine. We have what it takes to grow up in our salvation. We even have what it takes to participate in the divine nature.

Doesn't that phrase capture your curiosity? "Participate in the divine nature." What does it mean to "participate in the divine nature"? Born through water and the Word, we are made alive with God, alive with God alive in us. As we grow with Jesus, we are being re-created more and more in the image of God. As we grow with Jesus, we have God working in us and through us more and more.

You notice I said more and more. Just as Peter isn't content that we just taste God's Word, but that we crave God's Word, so also Peter isn't content that we just have a connection to God, but that God is alive and working in us. If we just want a God-connection without God alive and working in us, God will find someone else to live in and live through. So Peter says: "Make every effort to add to your faith goodness" "Make every effort" - we know what that means, right? "Make every effort" doesn't happen by just throwing these (Personal Ministry Plans) in the garbage. "Make every effort to [what?]" "Make every effort to add." That word "add" reminds me of when I was a kid cooking at the Holiday Inn in New Ulm. I started as dishwasher, until most of the kitchen cooks quit, and I was promoted to cook foods I had never heard of before. My boss

cook tells me to make some roux. I say, "What?" She says, "melt some butter and add some flour." I melt some butter and add some flour. She looks at it and says, "add a little more flour." I go back and add a teaspoon; I show her and she says, "add a little more." After a couple times of adding a little more, we're both getting frustrated; she takes the pan of melted butter and adds a whole lot of flour. And I thought, "You didn't 'just add a little,' you added a lot." That's the "add" word Peter uses. Don't just add a little; add a lot. We're not adding ghost peppers; we're adding grace - so add a lot.

At the same time that Peter says: "add a lot," Peter also tells us how to add. Don't just add on a thin veneer; work them in; work a whole lot of all these ingredients, in and through our lives.

Give specific and practical examples of how we might put Peter's words into action.

- add to your faith goodness -
- to goodness, add knowledge
- to knowledge add self-control -
- to self-control, add perseverance -
- to perseverance, add godliness (piety) -
- to godliness, add brotherly kindness (philadephia) -
- to brotherly kindness, add love (agape).

That's Peter's exercise plan. I made it sound more like a recipe. But this is exercise; this is action. This is how God makes us strong. This is how God give us forward movement. This is how God gives us momentum. This is how God blesses

us to make it. Not by sitting and resting, but by adding and exercising. Not by standing on the sidelines and watching others, but by adding and exercising. Not by making ourselves busy, chasing around, living the life of the world, but by adding God's ingredients, by exercising God's exercises.

How? We'll talk about that in Bible Study. And we'll do more than just talk; we'll find a way to walk that talk - together with each other, together with Jesus. Amen.

FIRST READING 1 Peter 1:22 – 2:3




