Three Devotions followed by the Service - Christmas Eve 2024

Devotion 1 - Gen 3 (after lesson)

Every day would have been like the perfect honeymoon.Every day like the perfect Christmas.Every day exploring God's gift of paradise.Every day enjoying God's gift of marriage.Every day tasting new treats, each one a gift from God.Every day wowing at God and his gift of life in paradise.

Then what? They listened to the lies of a liar. "God is holding out on you." "You know better than God. Don't listen to him. Go with your gut; trust your feelings. You're better off trusting your feelings than trusting God." They listened to the lies of the Liar. And what did it get them? A whole new experience, a whole new set of feelings - guilt and fear, shame and fear, bitterness and anger. A whole new way of life - hiding and denying, blaming and excusing.

We know those feelings, don't we - guilt and fear, shame and fear, bitterness and anger. We know that way of life - hiding and denying, blaming and excusing. We know those feelings, we know that way of life, because the Liar has lied to us and we've been suckered in to believe the Liar's lies, suckered into trusting our self instead of trusting the God who has given us so much. Now we know what it's like to live a broken life in a broken world. Now we know what it's like to live a dying life in a damned and dying world. Like Adam and Eve, we have put our self in place of God, trusting our self instead of trusting God. And like it cost Adam and Eve, it has cost us.

If you were God, and you saw how Adam and Eve disrespected you, how they disrespected your gifts to them, what would you do? I don't know what button I pressed, but lately it seems that my phone feed has been filled with stories of vengeance and revenge, making people pay. And what saddens me is how eager people seem to be to jump on that bandwagon - "make them pay."

But what does God do? For Adam and Eve, for us? He comes to us: "Where are you?" He comes to us giving us a chance to "fess up," to ask for forgiveness. And even before we do that, while we're still blaming and excusing, what does God do? He promises another gift, another set of gifts. I know it sounds a bit odd; God's promise for Adam and Eve and for us comes in the form of a curse on Satan the serpent. In God's curse on Satan, we have God's promise the gift of a New Start! God didn't turn his back on Adam and Eve; he hasn't turned his back on us. God didn't hand Adam and Eve over to the lies of the devil; he hasn't turned us over to the lies of the devil. Instead God gave Adam and Eve, and God gives us, a New Start. We don't have to live suckered lives believing the devil and his lies. We don't have to live a life of guilt and shame. We don't have to live a life of hiding and denying, blaming and excusing. We get to live a New Start with God.

It gets better. In this New Start, this New Life, with God, we aren't alone. God promised to Adam and Eve, and God has given to us the Gift of a Champion. A Champion to stand up for us and fight for us. A Champion to crush the devil's head; a Champion to silence the devil and put him in his place; a Champion to set us free from the devil's lies, free to live in the promise and paradise of God.

Devotion 2 - Isaiah 7 and 9 (before reading)

It's an awful feeling isn't it? An awful Truth. Too awful to tell. Too awful to admit. What is that awful feeling, that awful truth? "I'm wrong. I need help." We see it in other people, don't we? They're clearly wrong; they clearly need help; but they won't admit it, and so they founder. Maybe we see it in ourselves; maybe we refuse to see it in ourselves. We do see it in our next lesson. King Ahaz, King of Israel, knew he was on the wrong side of God; he knew he was in trouble; he knew he needed help. But he didn't want to admit it; he didn't want to accept help from the LORD; because he knew that if he did, he would have to listen to the LORD - and Ahaz was too in love with his pride, too in love with his sin to listen to the LORD.

But that didn't stop God. God saw his people hurting; God saw his people living lives of darkness and distress in a land of death. God knew he had a promise to keep. He had promised a Champion to stand up for his people, a Champion to crush the devil's head, a Champion to set his people free for life the way it is supposed to be. With Ahaz or without Ahaz, God would share his promise ... God would give himself.

First Isaiah shared God's sign: "A virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and will call him Immanuel" - "God with us." Then Isaiah tells us about this son - "He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace." He would be God's forever King. He would make life right for his people.

Don't be an Ahaz, too stubborn to listen to God. Instead, join Isaiah: "**For to us a child is born, to us a son is given**." Celebrate with Isaiah: "Jesus is born for me! God has given himself for me!"

Devotion 3 - Isaiah 40 (before lesson)

It didn't work - Living the life of the world didn't make life right for them. It didn't work - Lying and denying, blaming and excusing didn't get rid of their guilt and shame. It didn't work - Turning to the world for help didn't get them the help they needed. Instead it just got them kicked at and stepped on.

And what could we say? "Been there, done that." Too many times we've lived life the same way, and ended up the same way - beaten down, dark, and dirty.

But what did God say to his beaten-down people? What does God say to us? "**Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.**" But he doesn't just pat us on the hand or the head and say nice things to us. God doesn't just say words; God keeps his Word. To keep his Word, God gave himself and he gives himself.

That's what Christmas is about. Not just beautiful words and songs; not just beautiful lights and smiles. Christmas is about God giving us the gift of God himself. God giving us the gift of himself in the manger - Jesus stepping in for us, stepping up for us, to make life right for us. Then God giving us the gift of himself on the cross - Jesus stepping in for us, stepping up for us to pay for our sin. And now we have God giving us the gift of himself as our Good Shepherd - Jesus stepping in for us, Jesus stepping up for us to look out for us, provide for us, protect us, to hold us safe with him for life with God in heaven.

We don't have to live a life of chasing the world. We don't have to live a life of hide and deny with our guilt and shame. We don't have to life a life of searching for help in all the wrong places.

God has given us the best gift ever, the gift we need more than any other. God has given us the gift of Jesus, God himself.

But first, let us pray for people all over the world who would delight with us to know the good news of Jesus Christ, and who would join with us in singing his praises. Let us pray for the people of Lake County and for all those in our own congregation.

And, because this would please our Lord, let us remember, in his name, the poor and helpless, the cold, the hungry and the oppressed, the sick and those who are sad, the lonely and the unloved, the elderly and the little children. We especially remember all those who do not know the Lord Jesus, or who do not love him, or who by sin have grieved his heart of love.

Finally, let us remember before God all those who rejoice with us in heaven, who live in greater light than we, that multitude which no one can number, whose hope was in the Word made flesh, who died in faith, and who live before the throne of God and praise him each day in his temple. We confess that we are united with them as we are united with one another. To sum up all these petitions, let us pray as Christ himself taught us.

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For Your Safety During the Candle Lighting in This Service

- The Village of Libertyville and the Libertyville Fire Department require us to follow some rules when using hand-held candles. This is for your safety and the safety of all who worship here.
 - The ushers will hand out wax candles only to adults and teenagers. Children under 10 should not be allowed to hold a lit candle. LED candles are available for children and all who prefer them.
 - Ushers will be stationed to observe the whole worship area while the hand-held candles are lit. They are ready with fire extinguishers should any problem develop.
- Note where the exits are. In case of a fire, calmly proceed to the nearest exit.
- Once your candle is lit, always hold it upright.
- Keep the flame away from hair and clothing.
 - When the lights come on after the prayer, blow the candle out and hold it upright until you exit. After the service ushers will be waiting at the exits for candle disposal.
 - Please keep pieces of wax from falling on the floor. It will make the after-service cleanup much easier.
