Sermon followed by Service December 8, 2024 Luke 3:1-18

Did you read the headlines in the news today? I wish I didn't; they leave me with a sick feeling inside. To put it into ABC's - abuse, bloodshed, corruption - a world gone wrong. Our lesson today comes from a time with the same ABC's - abuse, bloodshed, corruption. Reading the history left me with another sick feeling inside. At the time of our lesson Tiberius Caesar, the Roman emperor, was a disgusting, bloody, miserable man, and when he died his people cheered in the streets. Pontius Pilate, ruler in Jerusalem, was a cruel, murderous man kicked out of office for his cruel and bloody ways. Herod stole and married his brother's wife and later had John the Baptist killed and his head served up on a platter. And Annas and Caiaphas? At the time of the Romans, the way to the priesthood was money and politics and now and then a bloody knife. It was a time when almost everybody in power was corrupt. And the people under them were either crushed or corrupted or both. It was a world gone wrong.

In his world gone wrong, God sent John to put a stop to the wrong and start making things right. And where did God have John point his finger, God's finger of judgment? Not just at them. Not just at them in power. Not just at them in the money. Not just at them that the world would call evil. God had John point His finger at you and me. God's way to change this world gone wrong isn't just to change them; it is to change us, to call us on our sin no matter how small or normal or acceptable we think our sin is.

And that right there might be one of our easiest and worst sins. In a world gone wrong, it is so easy to think our sin small, normal, acceptable ... and that they and them ... they need to be stopped in their sin; they are the ones who need to change. Well, God gave his Word to John to preach repentance, to preach a change of mind about all sin. Our sin isn't small, normal, acceptable. Our sin, every sin must be rejected. Every mountain and molehill that gets in the way of Jesus ... every valley, every hole, every rut that gets in the way of Jesus must be made level. Every crooked way must be made straight.

The Lord is coming and who can dare to meet him? Only he who has clean hands and a pure heart. Not those with cleaner hands and hearts, who aren't as dirty as someone else. But only those with clean hands and a pure heart. You heard Malachi - "Who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap [not a gentle soap, but a harsh, caustic, burning soap] ... He will purify ... and refine." We don't want that kind of cleaning. And God takes no pleasure in giving that kind of cleaning.

That's why when God gave John his Word of repentance, God also gave John his Word of baptism and forgiveness. In this world gone wrong, for hearts dirty and foul, God offers a washing that heals instead of burns. A washing of water and the Word ... a washing of forgiveness made possible in the blood of Jesus. Blood doesn't seem like much of a cleaner so how does that work? God took our sin and put it on Jesus; he attached your guilt to Jesus. Then at the cross God cursed Jesus as the sinner of our sins. He made Jesus pay. That payment, Jesus' life and death, his body and blood, satisfied and neutralized God's curse; it neutralized, canceled sin's attachment to Jesus and canceled sin's attachment to us. Jesus' death paid for our sin. His blood washed it away. Freed from our sin, God saw Jesus as sinless, clean, and right ... and raised him back to life. And you, in Jesus ... God sees you the same way - sinless, clean, and right in the blood of Christ. It's hard to see blood as a detergent, so Jesus gives us a washing that is easier for us to see - a washing with water and the

Word - in the washing of baptism "your sins are washed away ... you are forgiven!"

So now what? Let's look at our lesson. "The crowd asked -"What should we do then?" John answered: "The man with two tunics should share with him who has none, and the one who has food should do the same." And when tax collectors asked: "What should we do?" John told them: "Don't collect any more than you are required to." And when soldiers asked "what should we do?" He answered: "Don't extort money and don't accuse people falsely - be content with your pay." In that world gone wrong, when God's people asked "so now what?" what was John's answer? It wasn't "Go change the world ... go fix their wrong." God's answer was "Start with yourself - fix your wrong." And not just fix your wrong-doing, fix your wrong-thinking. Think and live like you have God taking care of you. Think and give like you have God giving to you. In this world gone wrong, God's way to change this world for the better is for us to be changed ... for us to bring his love into our world.

I've seen you do that with your gifts to our Share the Burden Fund and our Christmas gifts for Hillcrest. I've heard how you share the peace and hope of Jesus at work.

But I've also seen how we can be willing to fit right in with the world - answering their wrong with our wrong, answering their anger with our own anger. I've seen how we can be willing to fit in with the world with our priorities - making the world's priorities our priorities, playing with the world before we work with Christ, spending with the world before we give with Christ. I've seen how we can be willing to fit in with the world - belittling the Truth of Christ - "a little false teaching is OK if it helps us fit in the neighbors better, if it gets us what we want." We might think it small, normal, acceptable. I challenge you to find any of that thinking acceptable in His Word. Christ has his ax at the root of that tree to bring it down.

And he will have his way. Against a world gone wrong, he will have his way with judgment. And for his people who cry, "Lord, have mercy," he will have his way with mercy. He will have every valley filled in; he will have every mountain made low. He will have the crooked made straight, and the rough made smooth. He will make it so.

How? In this world gone wrong, he's given us his word to start with us. So prepare the way for the Lord in you! Let Jesus have his way in you and you will be part of how Jesus sets this world gone wrong right. Amen.


IN OUR WORSHIP TODAY ... we are pointed to the Coming One who will get his way - and his way will be peace and life made right!




CONFESSION OF SINS AND LIGHTING RITE

- M: However, God who is Love did not want to be separated from his children forever. He promised a Savior who would bear the punishment for sin, defeat the devil, and break the bonds of death.






- M: When the time had fully come, God sent his Son. Jesus, our Savior, has paid the ransom for your debt; your sins are forgiven (Galatians 4:4,5). In view of God's mercy, today we light the peace candle. Jesus tells us, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not be afraid" (John 14:27).
- C: Since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ (Romans 5:1).



M: In the peace of God we go to the world - to our friends, relatives, acquaintances and neighbors. We regard no one from a worldly point of view. If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come. All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation (2 Corinthians 5: 16-18). C: Yes, God has committed to us the ministry of reconciliation. We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. Jesus, who had no sin, became sin for us; in him we have become the righteousness of God (2 Corinthians 5:19-21).

"I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come," says the LORD Almighty.

But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? For he will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap. He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver; he will purify the Levites and refine them like gold and silver. "So I will come to put you on trial. "I the LORD do not change. So you, the descendants of Jacob, are not destroyed. Ever since the time of your ancestors you have turned away from my decrees and have not kept them.

GOSPEL

Luke 3:1–18

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar — when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of Iturea and Traconitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene — during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet:

"A voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him. Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill made low. The crooked roads shall become straight, the rough ways smooth. And all people will see God's salvation.' "

John said to the crowds coming out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. The ax is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire."

"What should we do then?" the crowd asked.

John answered, "Anyone who has two shirts should share with the one who has none, and anyone who has food should do the same."

Even tax collectors came to be baptized. "Teacher," they asked, "what should we do?"

"Don't collect any more than you are required to," he told them.

Then some soldiers asked him, "And what should we do?"

He replied, "Don't extort money and don't accuse people falsely—be content with your pay."

The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might possibly be the Messiah. John answered them all, "I baptize you with water. But one who is more powerful than I will come, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire." And with many other words John exhorted the people and proclaimed the good news to them.
