Sermon followed by Service

April 30, 2023 Isaiah 43:1-7

You've felt it, haven't you? That sick-inside feeling, that on-the-edge feeling, that stomach-churning, chest-tightening, hard-to-breath feeling that something is going to go wrong.

You've felt it, haven't you? And we don't just feel it, we know it, - something is going to go wrong. This year I raised our medical insurance deductibles; now I have three new doctors. Every time I get something fixed with the house, something bigger breaks. Every time I make a big financial move, the market tanks. Every time I look at the big family vacation picture, what do I see? Someone is missing. What do I know? Some day - maybe it's happening already - the family cancers will catch me, the family diabetes will stick me, the family Alzheimers will mess with my brain and leave me a fumbling, bumbling mess. Or maybe first, the angels will come and take my Lisa home, and leave me a fumbling, bumbling mess. Something bad is going to happen. Some days I feel it; every day, I know it.

In our lesson, the people Isaiah was writing to, they had it worse. They didn't just have a feeling that something bad was going to happen, they were already living it. They didn't just have a feeling, God had told them that trouble was coming - the Babylonians were coming. They didn't just have a recession or a depression or a stock market crash to look forward to; already the Assyrians (modern day Iraq) were bleeding the country dry

demanding tribute money - pay up or get beaten up; and soon the Babylonians would come and take everything that was left. They didn't just have houses that would crack and crumble, their cities and towns were already war-torn by the Assyrians, and soon they would be crumbled and crushed by the Babylonians. They didn't just have the joys of aging to look forward to, the time was coming when their children and grandchildren would be ripped from their homes and taken hundreds of miles away into captivity.

So what did Isaiah's people do? Some plugged their ears: "Don't trouble me with the truth; It'll all be fine and I'll be fine." Others were too tired too plug their ears: "It is what it is, and there's nothing we can do about it." Others figured: "It's everybody for themselves" and the bullies bullied, the cheaters cheated, the scammers scammed, and the rich and powerful had their way, until someone more powerful came along. Sounds familiar, doesn't it? But some looked up to God.

In our lesson, God speaks to them and whoever else would listen. And what does God say? First Isaiah reminds his people who God is - "This is what the LORD says— he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel." When trouble hits you, God isn't just some impersonal force of justice, some impersonal force of karma, working justice with no heart. And God isn't just some dis-interested bystander, standing by and watching, but not really caring; or some spectator at a martial arts cage match cheering and calling for blood. No, God had created Jacob and formed Israel. He had brought the Jewish people into being; they were somebody because God made them somebody.

He knows how his people are hurting, and he knows the hurt that is still coming their way. And what does he say to them?

What could he say to them? To the bullies and the cheaters, to those plugging their ears and those too tired to plug their ears, even to those looking to him, God could say: "You have it coming." And they did have it coming, all of them, even the beaten down and beaten up, even those looking up to him. All of them, like all of us, had shut their ears to God, rejecting God's way to go their own way, rejecting God's thing to do their own thing. God could have told them: "All the trouble that's coming your way, you have it coming, I'm sending it your way, and it's only a taste of the judgment you deserve." Again and again that's the message God had for Isaiah to tell his people. In fact, in the chapter right before our lesson, that's what God had just told his people. But now, God has something else to say to those who will listen.

And what did he say" "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior."

Oh, I love to hear that. All by myself, I can know trouble is coming, and feel trouble is coming, and know that I have it coming. But Isaiah tells me what I can't know or feel by myself. God says to me and he says to you: "Fear not, for I have

redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior." When trouble hits, I don't need to be afraid; you don't need to be afraid.

When I hear Isaiah tell me that, I wonder: "How can I know that's for me? I'm not Jacob or Israel; I don't have the blood of Jacob and Israel." But here, in his Word, God called you to be his. Here, in baptism, God put his name on you; he adopted you as his. God's promise here to Jacob, to Israel, is God's promise to you.

So when you have that sick feeling inside that something bad is going to happen, when you just know that something bad is going to happen, when you're already in trouble and you just know it's going to get worse, remember what the LORD who created you and formed you and got you this far says to you: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior." Think of Israel going though the Red Sea; think of the three Men in the Fiery Furnace. When life is hot against you; when trouble is up to here [your neck] and deep to drown you,

with the LORD you don't have to be alone; with the LORD you won't be alone. You have God to hold you as his.

This is how much you mean to him: "I give Egypt for your ransom, Cush and Seba in your stead. Since you are precious and honored in my sight, and because I love you, I will give men in exchange for you, and people in exchange for your life." What's that about? We might think of when God delivered Israel from Egypt at the expense of Egypt. Or like God and Isaiah we can look ahead from our lesson to the time when God's people are held captive in Babylon and the Persian Cyrus the Great frees God's people at much the same time he goes after the Egyptians. I wish I knew more of that history and how it fits here. But even better is how God gave his Son Jesus in exchange for you and for me. Instead of judging you and me guilty; he judged Jesus as guilty. Instead of holding you and me for punishment; God satisfied justice with Jesus nailed to the cross, so he can hold you and me as forgiven. We don't have to live waiting for the shoe to drop; we don't have to live with that sick feeling wondering when God will strike us. With Jesus, you get to hear: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior."

"I will be with you." Do you ever feel too far away from God for that to be true? Do you have someone - family or friend

- who feels too far from God? Listen to what God says to you: "Do not be afraid, for I am with you; I will bring your children from the east and gather you from the west. I will say to the north, 'Give them up!' and to the south, 'Do not hold them back.' Bring my sons from afar and my daughters from the ends of the earth— everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made." If, when you feel far from God, don't make that God's judgment on you. Listen to his invitation: "Come to me, return to me, walk with me, follow me."

And when you feel something is going to go wrong, listen to his promise: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior." Amen.



SERMON Isaiah 43:1-7

NICENE CREED
