Sermon Followed by Service

May 28, 2023

Ezekiel 37:1-14

Ever have the breath knocked out of you? The first time I remember having the breath knocked out of me, I was in third grade and a hundred pound mountain by the name of Chad Tweit fell on my back. I could feel my eyes being pushed out of their sockets and my tongue being pulled down my throat. I thought I was going to die. Do you know the feeling? It isn't until we can't take a breath that we realize how important breathing is for our life.

In the same way we often take the breath of the Holy Spirit for granted. We might not realize and appreciate what the Spirit gives us until our souls are empty and gasping without him.

In our lesson, Ezekiel's congregation seems to be past gasping. It's about 600 years before Christmas. Ezekiel's congregation has been torn from their homes in Jerusalem and sent into exile in Babylon. They're hopeless, despairing, crying, "**Our bones are dried up and our hope is gone; we are cut off.**" Have you ever felt so depressed that your bones ached? In his psalms, David sang that way about his guilt. Here Ezekiel talks that way about his peoples' hopelessness. The exiles are tired and depressed. They feel shriveled with no strength to make it through the day. Their homeland has been pillaged, their beautiful temple destroyed. Now they're in exile hundreds of miles from home with nothing to live for, no hope of returning home. Ezekiel's promises, and God's promises that they would return home meant nothing to them. The people had no hope; they were just putting in their time, waiting for their life to get over with and die. For those people God gave Ezekiel a vision, a picture of his people: "**The hand of the LORD was upon me, and he brought me out by the Spirit of the LORD and set me in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones.** ² **He led me back and forth among them, and I saw a great many bones on the floor of the valley, bones that were very dry.**" God's people had become a picture of death. Everywhere Ezekiel looked he saw meatless, dry bones bleaching in the sun, bones so dead and dry a dog wouldn't even want them. God's people were a picture of death, a death valley.

It looked hopeless, but the Lord tells Ezekiel: "Prophesy to these bones and say to them, 'I will make breath enter you, and you will come to life." Talk to the dead bones and promise them life. It doesn't make sense, but Ezekiel did it. And this is what he sees: "as I was prophesying, there was a noise, a rattling sound, and the bones came together, bone to bone. ⁸ I looked, and tendons and flesh appeared on them and skin covered them, but there was no breath in them." Almost sounds like a late-night horror movie. Bones rattle around and come together as skeletons; muscle and flesh appear on the bones and cover them. But they're still lifeless, so God tells Ezekiel: "Prophesy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say ... 'Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe into these slain, that they may live.'" So I prophesied as he commanded me, and breath entered them; they came to life and stood up on their feet—a vast army."

Sounds like a great Easter lesson - God raising the dead to life. But what God says makes this an even better Pentecost lesson. God tells his people: "**I will put my Spirit in you and you will live**." Israel had become a people dead to God, lifeless, hopeless. But God promises, by the power of his Spirit, to wake his people up, to bring them back to life, to give them hope, and make them to be his people, a vast army for God.

What does that mean for us? At times we might look around in the church and instead of seeing a vast army for God we might see dry bones, tired bones, aching bones. We might wonder about the tired bones: "What can those tired bones do?" We might ask about the lifeless, dry bones: "What will they ever do?" Or seeing the dead, dry bones around us we might just gasp: "Why bother?" showing we can be a bit tired and dead ourselves. Perhaps we feel stuck in the valley of dead, dry bones and feel too tired, too hopeless, too Spiritless to be any different. Or maybe we feel so dead to God - his law doesn't jolt us, his love doesn't warm us - perhaps we feel so dead to God we figure "dead to God isn't all that bad ... because I'm alive in the world."

We might wonder - why does the church sometimes look and act like a valley of dead, dry bones? Ezekiel's congregation felt lifeless with God, breathless without the Spirit, because they had been too busy chasing the life of their neighbors. They wanted to be like the rest of the world; they wanted the stuff of the world; they wanted to fit in and be friends with the world. And that chase left them breathless. So - little by little - they stopped chasing after God; they even stopped walking with God because they didn't have the time or energy for both life with God and life in the world. And besides, God's way didn't fit their way, so they went their own way instead of God's way. They gave up the Spirit of Truth (a little bit here, and little bit there) to fit in better with their friends. It doesn't sound right, but God's people gave up life with God. And then they had the breath knocked out of them. They wanted the life of the world, so God stepped back and let the world have at them. And the world treated them the way a turkey vulture goes after dead meat, leaving nothing but dead, dry bones.

When we look at our congregation directory, we see some of that same deadness, for the same reasons. Chasing after the life and the stuff of the world. Stepping back from God as too tired, too busy. Giving up the Spirit of Truth to fit in. Arguing with God over who is the boss. Blaming God when they get their breath knocked out of them. On so many pages, what looks to be dry bones. Sad, and sadder still because they knew better; they were warned. Like we know better and we've been warned. Yet what? - we have some of that same dead, dry bone thinking in us, thinking that would leave us gasping for the Spirit.

When you're gasping, gasping for breath in your rat race, gasping for hope, gasping for purpose, gasping for the Spirit of God ... when you see others gasping for the Spirit ... when you see the valleys of dead dry bones ... remember what the Spirit did in Ezekiel's vision. By his breath and preaching the Spirit gave life to those dead bones. God restored his people and by his Spirit they again knew God as Lord.

By that same Spirit, God restores us. Instead of leaving us on the bone pile of the cursed, dead to God and insisting on living life our way ... instead of leaving us with the breath knocked out of us, crashed and burned-out by the rat race ... instead of leaving us Godless, hopeless, and lifeless ...

By the Spirit, God has restored you. He's given you the cross of Christ, his suffering and death to pay for our dead-to-God sin. He's given you the life of Jesus to be your life - right and holy before God. By the Spirit of God - in water and the Word - he restores you to life in the family of God. By the Spirit, he sets you free from the rat race of this world to walk, to run, to soar with God. By the Spirit of God, we don't need to feel burned out, crashed out, run out. By the Spirit of God, you have the love of God, the victory of Christ, the hope of heaven. By the Spirit of God, you are restored with the power and promise of God to be the army of God - bringing God's love to this world and putting evil in its place.

Yes, by the Spirit, you have God to make you alive. Don't wait until you're gasping. Don't wait til you have the breath knocked out of you. Let the Spirit fill you with life, God's life! Amen.

FIRST READING

Acts 2:1–21

When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?"

Some, however, made fun of them and said, "They have had too much wine."

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd:

"Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel:

" 'In the last days, God says,

I will pour out my Spirit on all people.

Your sons and daughters will prophesy,

your young men will see visions,

your old men will dream dreams.

Even on my servants, both men and women,

I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy.

I will show wonders in the heavens above

and signs on the earth below,

blood and fire and billows of smoke.

The sun will be turned to darkness

and the moon to blood

before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord.

And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.'

SERMON

Ezekiel 37:1-14

The hand of the LORD was on me, and he brought me out by the Spirit of the LORD and set me in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. I said, "Sovereign LORD, you alone know."

Then he said to me, "Prophesy to these bones and say to them, 'Dry bones, hear the word of the LORD! I will attach tendons to you and make flesh come upon you and cover you with skin; I will put breath in you, and you will come to life. Then you will know that I am the LORD.' "

So I prophesied as I was commanded. And as I was prophesying, there was a noise, a rattling sound, and the bones came together, bone to bone. I looked, and tendons and flesh appeared on them and skin covered them, but there was no breath in them.

Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath; prophesy, son of man, and say to it, 'This is what the Sovereign LORD says: Come, breath, from the four winds and breathe into these slain, that they may live.' " So I prophesied as he commanded me, and breath entered them; they came to life and stood up on their feet—a vast army.

Then he said to me: "Son of man, these bones are the people of Israel. They say, 'Our bones are dried up and our hope is gone; we are cut off.' Therefore prophesy and say to them: 'This is what the Sovereign LORD says: My people, I am going to open your graves and bring you up from them; I will bring you back to the land of Israel. Then you, my people, will know that I am the LORD, when I open your graves and bring you up from them. I will put my Spirit in you and you will live, and I will settle you in your own land. Then you will know that I the LORD have spoken, and I have done it, declares the LORD.'"
