Sermon followed by Service

May 7, 2023

John 14:1-11

Imagine with me the vacation of your hopes and dreams. Are you imagining beaches or mountains, or both? Now imagine with me the house of your hopes and dreams - is it a mansion or an RV? Imagine the job of your hopes and dreams, with the perfect boss. Now imagine, for years you've been hoping and dreaming. For years, you've been all in, living, giving, sacrificing to make your hopes and dreams come true. And now, it's time. You're in the airport VIP lounge; you're in the realtor's office; it looks like your new boss is about to shake your hand. Finally, after years of hoping and dreaming, living, giving, sacrificing your all, it's time for your hopes and dreams to come true.

Except it isn't. Those hopes and dreams you've had, they aren't coming true. That dream vacation, that dream house, that dream job - they aren't going to happen. As you feel your hopes and dreams coming apart, as you're trying to figure it all out, you hear something that sounds - I don't know - like or let-down or like something too good to be true. Your travel agent offers you a better vacation than you could have ever hoped for, everything included, free! The realtor offers you a better home than you could have ever hoped for, a mansion, fully furnished with everything you could need, and a garage big enough for your new RV. And instead of that job that just fell through, you are offered an even better job, better than you could have ever hoped for. At the same time your hopes and dreams are falling apart, you are promised the best life ever. With all that - your hopes and dreams crashing; a bigger, better promise and life in front of you - what's going through your mind? Are you ready to leave behind your hopes and dreams just like that? Are you ready to jump on the new promise, just like that?

Maybe that's why Jesus is so patient in our lesson. It's Maundy Thursday night, oops! It's Holy Thursday night, just days after Palm Sunday. Just days after "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" The disciples started the week riding high on expectations. Now, after a week on edge, the disciples know that something big is about to happen. They seem to be expecting something big, that somehow Jesus is going to usher in his new kingdom, and life is going to get good, very good. But the more that Jesus talks about glory, the more Jesus tells them that life is about to get hard, very hard. Soon, very soon, one of them would betray him. Soon, very soon, Jesus would be going where they couldn't yet go. That night Peter would deny him. Can you feel the disciples' hopes and dreams coming apart? Can you feel the angst in the room?

Jesus could. And so Jesus speaks to their hearts: "**Do not let your hearts be troubled**." That's more than just, "Don't worry." There's a whole lot more turmoil going on in the room than just worry. So "**Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God, trust also in me.**" Even if they weren't sure about Jesus and what Jesus was saying, they could still trust in God. And because they could trust in God, Jesus is telling them, they could trust in him. And then Jesus does what he and the Father and his Spirit have done throughout the Bible - when life for God's people gets hard, when life is disappointing, God gives us a promise to pick us up and hold us together. And Jesus knew exactly the promise to share. Jesus knew the angst in the room; not just because he felt his disciples' angst, but because he could feel the turmoil in his own heart. The thought of Judas betraying him, Peter denying him, his Father cursing him, crushing him, crossing him with the guilt of the world and the judgment of hell - it was all tearing at Jesus. Through it all, Jesus knew what kept him going - the promise of heaven, the promise of heaven together with his disciples around him, the promise of heaven together with God and his church. What kept Jesus together was the promise of heaven together with you and me.

So what promise did Jesus give his disciples? Much the same promise that kept him going. "In my Father's house are many rooms [many mansions]; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." The promise that kept Jesus going to the cross and through the cross to heaven is the promise that Jesus gave to his disciples. It's the promise that Jesus has given to you and to me!

That's right - Jesus gives his disciples one of our most favorite promises ever. And what do the disciples do? They don't know what to think or say. After all that Jesus has taught his disciples, Thomas still said: "We don't know where you are going." After all that Jesus had shown his disciples, Philip still says, "It would be enough if you would just show us the **Father.**" It's kind of like Jesus serving up the best, most tender, juicy, tasty steak, and Thomas asks: "Where's the ketchup?" Jesus offers up the best, most tender, juicy tasty steak, and Philip says: "McDonalds would be fine." What? Don't you get what Jesus just promised you? We wouldn't do that, would we?

We do do that, don't we? In the midst of our worst days ever, Jesus offers us the best promise of heaven forever, but instead of wowing at what Jesus has for us, we pick at what Jesus says: "What? How's that going to work?" Jesus offers us the best of heaven forever, but instead of grabbing hold of that promise, we ask for something far smaller, just a little pick-meup for right here, right now.

We can get so stuck on what we want that we overlook and belittle what God has for us. We can get so stuck on our plans that we miss what God is promising us.

It's amazing how patient Jesus was and is. He could have pulled his promise off the table - "Don't like what I'm offering, I'll give it to someone else." "All you can do is pick at what I say? You can't be bothered to remember what I've said again and again? I'll find someone who will appreciate and hold on to what I say." Jesus could have said: "You don't like the way I do things, fine then." Jesus could have laid that on his disciples; he could lay that down on us. Instead he is so patient.

Again and again, he points us to his cross - "Your doubt, your picking at my promises, your forgetfulness, it's all forgiven. Your damn pride that thinks you know better than I do - it's all forgiven. Your petty hopes and dreams that you hold as more precious than all the treasures of heaven - they're all forgiven. You're all forgiven." Forgiven - that's not just a word for Jesus. It's his heart for you eager to share his hope and promise with you.

What does that mean for us? What does that mean when our troubles have us all bent out of shape? What does it mean for us when our troubles have us all forgetful? Jesus, instead of rolling his eyes at us, he shares his promise, the promise that got him through his turmoil and trouble: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am."

When life in this world is churning all around you, when life in this world is churning inside you, when life is disappointing you, when you think that God is disappointing you, take hold of his promise - Jesus has a life for you better than you could ever imagine. Jesus has a place for you in heaven. Jesus has a place for you with him. Amen.

and,


"A stone that causes people to stumble

SERMON

John 14:1-11

NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

In your mercy hear the prayers of all who call on you in any trouble, that they may have the joy of receiving your help in their need. We ask this through Christ, our Lord. **Amen.**

WORDS OF INSTITUTION


