We Have the Best Father!

"My dad is bigger than your dad ... my dad is smarter than your dad ... my dad is richer than your dad." You've heard it. So who has the best father? Who wins the "best father" contest? We win! We have the best Father!

Why? We have God as our Father! How can that be? What makes us God's children? Some people would say everybody is a child of God; but God doesn't say that. Some would say that everyone who does good is a child of God; but God doesn't say that. So whom does God say are his children? "To all who receive Jesus, to those who believe in his name, he gives the right to become children of God - children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God." Born of God, made alive with Jesus, believing in Jesus as your Savior, God calls you his children. That's why we get to say: "I have the best Father."

"I have the best father." For some people, those are fighting words, words to start a fight. For us, "we have the best Father" are fighting words, words to get us through the fight. In our lesson Paul points us to our Father to make us strong for when evil attacks; and evil will attack. The forces of evil out there (the forces that put the thorns and the nails, the spit and the hurt on God's Son Jesus) are working to put the hurt on you as

God's children. So many of you could talk about how it hurts when you ask family and friends to join you with Jesus, and they will not. Instead, you see the smirks, the looks; you hear the words; all aimed to hurt you, as if doing God's thing were somehow evil. We could share with each other how that hurt, or just the fear of that hurt, sometimes keeps us from living, doing, speaking up as a child of God. Yes, evil is waging its war against us, and it hurts. So Paul points us to the Father to make us strong for the fight.

As God's children that's not the only fight we face. Evil isn't just out there; evil wages war in here, too. You know that fight, that hurt; you learn it the hard way over and over again. On Father's Day, you want to do right by Dad, but you mess up. As a Father you get the special card, the special kiss, but then you blow it - someone tests your patience and you blow up on the people you love, or maybe just as bad, you "cave man" with your video games or screen instead of loving the people God gave you to love. You know the hurt - it doesn't matter whether you're father, mother, husband, wife, child, or feeling all alone - we want to love our family like our Father in heaven loves us, but our impatience, anger, selfishness fight against us and we blow it. Like Paul said: "The good I want to do, I do not; the evil I don't want to do, I keep on doing. What a wretch, what a wreck, what a ruin am I."

At those times, what kind of Father do you need? Or let me ask it a different way - what kind of father don't you need? As a child, when you mess up - whether you spill the milk or split your brother's head - when you mess up and you know you did wrong

and it hurts - what kind of father don't you need? You don't need a father yelling: "Why can't you get anything right?" You don't need a father threatening: "You better get it right or else." When the evil out there hurts your heart in here, what kind of father don't you need? You don't need a heartless father with no better answer than bossing: "Get tough and get over it." This world has its share of those fathers. We need better. What we need is a caring Father to make us strong; a loving Father to forgive us and make us right. And we have that kind of Father! "For you did not receive a spirit that makes you a slave again to fear, but you received the Spirit of sonship. And by him we cry, "Abba, Father.""

When the Holy Spirit made you alive as God's child he didn't point you to your Father and say: "You better get it right or else." Instead he pointed you to the God Most High, the God Most Holy and Powerful; and he put it into your heart that you get to call him: "Father." Not "Sir." But "Father." With our Father who art in heaven, you get to be like that hurting child who runs to dad: "Dad, I'm sorry. Dad, I hurt." You get to be that child who knows everything will be all right in dad's arms. That's the kind of Father you have.

Think of what that means. When the evil inside you gets the best of you - when you feel like a wretch with guilt - you have a Father you can go to and say: "Father, I'm sorry" and no matter what you have done your Father will hold you close and say to you: "My son, my daughter ... I love you no matter what you have done. No matter what you have done, Jesus died for your sin; he paid for your sin. With Jesus, it's gone, forgotten.

With Jesus, you're forgiven. You're right by me." That's the Father you have in heaven.

And when the evil out there tears you down ... when your world is falling apart, turning against you ... you have a Father you can cry to: "Father, where are you? Father, why? Father, how long?" And even if you hurt and cry and carry on way more than someone thinks you need to, your Father takes you in his arms and dries your tears: "You know who I am; no matter how bad things look, I'm still God. And - don't you forget it - you're my daughter, my son. I'll make things right for you." That's the Father you have for you in heaven.

To him you can pray: "Father." You can pray: "Father, thy will be done" without fearing his will. You can pray: "Father, forgive us our trespasses." You can pray: "Father, deliver us from evil." You can pray: "Father," knowing your Father who art in heaven will work his will for you - he will forgive; he will deliver you.

Sounds good, doesn't it? But our lesson doesn't stop there. Why not? Because praying "Abba, Father" doesn't stop all the evil; and our Father's smile doesn't stop all the hurt. You know that, don't you? But your Father who art in heaven has something more for you. Paul says: "Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory." Think about it - as the children of God, you are heirs of God! With Jesus you get to share in the glory of God. With Jesus you get to share in the home, the heaven of

God. Imagine a life safe and secure from evil; no evil inside or out. Imagine a life free from sickness and hurt. Imagine a life where everything you think is right, everything you do works right, every word out of your mouth sounds right - that's the life your Father has for you! And your Father doesn't just say: "I love you; I want the best for you." Your Father is the God who can make what he wants for you to be true for you!

So let the world argue about who's the biggest, best, richest, smartest. We have the best - our Father who art in heaven! Amen.

INVOCATION

In the name of the Father and of the T Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

CONFESSION

Our Savior Jesus Christ commanded Baptism when he said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

All of us are born into this world with a deep need for Baptism. From our parents we inherit a sinful nature; we are without true fear of God and true faith in God and are condemned to eternal death. But while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. He took away our sin by giving his life on the cross. In Baptism, he clothes us with the robe of his righteousness and gives us a new life. We recall what Baptism means for our daily lives:

Baptism means that the sinful nature in us should be drowned by daily sorrow and repentance, and that all its evil deeds and desires be put to death. It also means that a new person should daily arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

As baptized children of God, we confess our sins:

Holy God, gracious Father,

I am sinful by nature

and have sinned against you in my thoughts, words, and actions.

I have not loved you with my whole heart;

I have not loved others as I should.

I deserve your punishment both now and forever.

But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins

with his innocent suffering and death.

Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Silence for meditation and reflection

God saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit and united us to the death and resurrection of Jesus. Every day God forgives your sins, removes your guilt, and strengthens you to defeat Satan's power. His promise is for you and your children, and he will never forsake you. Your sins are forgiven. You are clothed with Christ. You are at peace with God now and forever.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Gospel according to St. Mark:

"But the father said to his servants, 'Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Bring the fattened calf and kill it. Let's have a feast and celebrate. For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' So they began to celebrate.

"Meanwhile, the older son was in the field. When he came near the house, he heard music and dancing. So he called one of the servants and asked him what was going on. 'Your brother has come,' he replied, 'and your father has killed the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.'

"The older brother became angry and refused to go in. So his father went out and pleaded with him. But he answered his father, 'Look! All these years I've been slaving for you and never disobeyed your orders. Yet you never gave me even a young goat so I could celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours who has squandered your property with prostitutes comes home, you kill the fattened calf for him!'

"'My son,' the father said, 'you are always with me, and everything I have is yours. But we had to celebrate and be glad, because this brother of yours was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.'"


LORD'S PRAYER
