Sermon followed by Service

June 9, 2024

"I had a dream. Now you tell me my dream. And interpret my dream; tell me what my dream means." Sounds like that could be a game, a game that could go horribly wrong. For Nebuchadnezzar it wasn't a game; for his magicians, enchanters, soothsayers it wasn't a game. Nebuchadnezzar expected an answer, the right answer; and if he didn't get his right answer he would turn his magicians, enchanters, and soothsayers into body parts. "Tell me my dream; tell me what it means; get it right right now - or else."

Should I be expecting dreams and visions from God? What is the danger in thinking my dreams are messages from God? What is the danger in looking for message-filled dreams and visions from God?

Nebuchadnezzar wasn't playing a game. When his magicians, enchanters, soothsayers couldn't tell him his dream, he sent out his enforcers to start executing, to start slicing bodies into body parts. When they went looking for Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego to cut them into body parts, that's when Daniel first heard of Nebuchadnezzar's dream demands. So what does Daniel do? He doesn't run and hide. He doesn't blow and bluster. He doesn't whine and complain about how life is so unfair. No, first he speaks to his executioner with wisdom and tact, then he goes in to Nebuchadnezzar, not to argue, but to ask for time. With his extra time, what does Daniel do? He doesn't run and hide; he doesn't blow and bluster; he doesn't whine and complain. He prays. He goes home and gets his people -Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego - to pray. They pray to the God of heaven for mercy.

And that night in a vision, God gives Daniel the answer. He shows Daniel Nebuchadnezzar's dream and reveals its meaning.

So what was the dream? Nebuchadnezzar saw a statue - an enormous, dazzling, awesome statue. Its head made of pure gold, its chest and arms of silver, its belly and thighs of bronze, and its legs and feet of iron and clay. If you're dreaming that dream, what are you thinking? "Wow!" And maybe "What?" Do you identify with that awesome statue? Or against that statue? Do you see that statue as for you or against you? I think if you're the great Nebuchadnezzar, in some way you identify with that statue; in some way you see yourself in that statue. But you don't have too much time to think. As you're wowing and whatting, a rock is cut out from a mountain. How? By whom? Not by human hands. That rock strikes the statue in its legs, and the whole statue is smashed to smithereens and blown away by the wind. Now what are you thinking? That statue that had you wowing is gone. Is that good? Does it mean trouble? No wonder Nebuchadnezzar wanted answers!

When dreams have you on edge, where do we look for peace?

Daniel has more for Nebuchadnezzar and us than just the dream, Daniel has its meaning. The gold head of the statue stood for Nebuchadnezzar. God had given him dominion, power, might, and glory; God had made him king of kings, and ruler over all. Wow! But a silver kingdom would come after his gold kingdom, a bronze kingdom would come after the silver kingdom - we're told almost nothing of those kingdoms - and then an iron and clay kingdom would come - iron crushing everything before it, clay brittle; a kingdom strong and brittle, never united.

Looking back in history, we can add some detail to what Daniel tells us about the Four Kingdoms. First, we have the Babylonian Empire with Nebuchadnezzar as its greatest ruler; then we have the empire of the Medes and Persians; then the Greek Empire with Alexander the Great; then the Roman Empire. We're not told why God judged the Medo-Persian, Greek, and Roman Empires to be successively inferior. Maps and history books might argue. But we are told what happened to those four kingdoms - each of them was replaced, and then they were all smashed to smithereens and blown away by the wind. The greatest of rulers were replaced one after another; the greatest of kingdoms replaced and smashed and blown away.

What do you know of these four kingdoms? What happened to them? How did God use them?

The God of the heavens was giving Nebuchadnezzar some perspective. As great as Nebuchadnezzar was and thought himself to be - he would be replaced, and his kingdom would be smashed and blown away. And that perspective wasn't just meant for Nebuchadnezzar. Daniel wrote this part of his book in Aramaic, the international language of his day. Just as Nebuchadnezzar would be replaced, so also the kingdoms coming after Nebuchadnezzar would be replaced, smashed, and blown away. A timely reminder for us in America, isn't it? As so many are on edge fretting about the future of our great and blessed country, as so many are willing to say or do or approve of most anything to advance their idea of America as a great and blessed country, what do we want to remember? The greatest kings and kingdoms of this world are all - one after another replaced, smashed, and blown away. And there are no politics or politicians that will change that. Does that mean we just throw up our hands and sigh together: "it is what it is"? No, but it would be alright to think before we say or do or approve the worst of politics for the sake of a king and kingdom that can not and will not ever be able to do what we want it to do - no political power will ever be able to make life right the way we need life made right.

When we are ready to justify ourselves with the age-old excuses: "He started it; they did it first; we're just fighting fire with fire," consider this: "For whom did Jesus reserve his harshest criticism - those on the other side of the culture war? Or those thinking they were on God's side in the culture war?"

I said that Nebuchadnezzar's dream is good to give perspective. It's even better because it gives us hope. How? Do you remember that rock? The rock cut, but not by human hands? What is the meaning of that rock? Again and again in the Old Testament, who is the Rock? "**The LORD is my Rock, my fortress and my deliverer.**" And the Messiah is the stone rejected by men but chosen by God to be the cornerstone for his kingdom. In our Gospel Lesson, we heard Jesus point to himself as the Rock that crushes. Put that all together and who does Nebuchadnezzar's dream point to? During the time of the Roman Empire, the kingdom of iron and clay, "**in those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree**" ... and what did God do? When the time was right, God cut Jesus loose to establish his kingdom, a kingdom that has grown to fill the earth. His kingdom will never be destroyed; his kingdom will never be replaced; his kingdom will rule forever.

What did that mean for Daniel and the people of God? The powers of this world - as powerful as they were and are, as evil as they were and are against God's people - the powers of this world would not and will not last; they would and will be replaced, smashed, and blown away. In place of the powers of this world, we get to know there is a kingdom, as strong as rock, a kingdom in which God rules to make life right for his people. In later chapters, Daniel will tell us more about that Rock, more about that King and Kingdom. Today, I don't want to steal his thunder. Let me tell you this -

Instead of a King and Kingdom that rules by fear and by force, instead of a King and a Kingdom that bullies and enslaves, instead of the Nebuchadnezzars and Caesars and Herods of this world, in Jesus we have a King and a Kingdom that rules with gentleness and peace - "**Come to me all you who are burdened**, and I will give you rest." Instead of a King and a Kingdom that uses the cross to punish and instill fear, in Jesus we have a King and a Kingdom that uses the cross to redeem and forgive. In Christ and his Kingdom, the King calls you forgiven and right by God. In Christ and his Kingdom, the King sees you as his to hold and care for. In Christ and his Kingdom, the King sees you, not just as subjects, but as partners in ministry - working his blessing, sharing his treasures, ruling with him at God's right hand. And in his Kingdom ... instead of a King and Kingdom that will be replaced, smashed, and blown away, in Christ and his Kingdom, you have his plan and promise ruling forever.

In which kingdom has God called you to serve?

What important truths will guide us as we seek to serve faithfully?

That's not just a dream. That is God's vision for his Kingdom, a vision coming true in history, a vision true in Christ and true for you. Amen.



Daniel 2:26-28, 31-45

FIRST READING

The king asked Daniel (also called Belteshazzar), "Are you able to tell me what I saw in my dream and interpret it?"

Daniel replied, "No wise man, enchanter, magician or diviner can explain to the king the mystery he has asked about, but there is a God in heaven who reveals mysteries. He has shown King Nebuchadnezzar what will happen in days to come. Your dream and the visions that passed through your mind as you were lying in bed are these:

"Your Majesty looked, and there before you stood a large statue—an enormous, dazzling statue, awesome in appearance. The head of the statue was made of pure gold, its chest and arms of silver, its belly and thighs of bronze, its legs of iron, its feet partly of iron and partly of baked clay. While you were watching, a rock was cut out, but not by human hands. It struck the statue on its feet of iron and clay and smashed them. Then the iron, the clay, the bronze, the silver and the gold were all broken to pieces and became like chaff on a threshing floor in the summer. The wind swept them away without leaving a trace. But the rock that struck the statue became a huge mountain and filled the whole earth.

"This was the dream, and now we will interpret it to the king. Your Majesty, you are the king of kings. The God of heaven has given you dominion and power and might and glory; in your hands he has placed all mankind and the beasts of the field and the birds in the sky. Wherever they live, he has made you ruler over them all. You are that head of gold.

"After you, another kingdom will arise, inferior to yours. Next, a third kingdom, one of bronze, will rule over the whole earth. Finally, there will be a fourth kingdom, strong as iron—for iron breaks and smashes everything—and as iron breaks things to pieces, so it will crush and break all the others. Just as you saw that the feet and toes were partly of baked clay and partly of iron, so this will be a divided kingdom; yet it will have some of the strength of iron in it, even as you saw iron mixed with clay. As the toes were partly iron and partly clay, so this kingdom will be partly strong and partly brittle. And just as you saw the iron mixed with baked clay, so the people will be a mixture and will not remain united, any more than iron mixes with clay.

"In the time of those kings, the God of heaven will set up a kingdom that will never be destroyed, nor will it be left to another people. It will crush all those kingdoms and bring them to an end, but it will itself endure forever. This is the meaning of the vision of the rock cut out of a mountain, but not by human hands—a rock that broke the iron, the bronze, the clay, the silver and the gold to pieces.

"The great God has shown the king what will take place in the future. The dream is true and its interpretation is trustworthy."

Daniel 2
