FIRST READING 2 Chronicles 33:1–16

Manasseh was twelve years old when he became king, and he reigned in Jerusalem fifty-five years. He did evil in the eyes of the LORD, following the detestable practices of the nations the LORD had driven out before the Israelites. He rebuilt the high places his father Hezekiah had demolished; he also erected altars to the Baals and made Asherah poles. He bowed down to all the starry hosts and worshiped them. He built altars in the temple of the LORD, of which the LORD had said, "My Name will remain in Jerusalem forever." In both courts of the temple of the LORD, he built altars to all the starry hosts.

He sacrificed his children in the fire in the Valley of Ben Hinnom, practiced divination and witchcraft, sought omens, and consulted mediums and spiritists. He did much evil in the eyes of the LORD, arousing his anger.


He took the image he had made and put it in God's temple, of which God had said to David and to his son Solomon, "In this temple and in Jerusalem, which I have chosen out of all the tribes of Israel, I will put my Name forever. I will not again make the feet of the Israelites leave the land I assigned to your ancestors, if only they will be careful to do everything I commanded them concerning all the laws, decrees and regulations given through Moses." But Manasseh led Judah and the people of Jerusalem astray, so that they did more evil than the nations the LORD had destroyed before the Israelites.

The LORD spoke to Manasseh and his people, but they paid no attention. So the LORD brought against them the army commanders of the king of Assyria, who took Manasseh prisoner, put a hook in his nose, bound him with bronze shackles and took him to Babylon. In his distress he sought the favor of the LORD his God and humbled himself greatly before the God of his ancestors. And when he prayed to him, the LORD was moved by his entreaty and listened to his plea; so he brought him back to Jerusalem and to his kingdom. Then Manasseh knew that the LORD is God.

Afterward he rebuilt the outer wall of the City of David, west of the Gihon spring in the valley, as far as the entrance of the Fish Gate and encircling the hill of Ophel; he also made it much higher. He stationed military commanders in all the fortified cities in Judah.

He got rid of the foreign gods and removed the image from the temple of the LORD, as well as all the altars he had built on the temple hill and in Jerusalem; and he threw them out of the city. Then he restored the altar of the LORD and sacrificed fellowship offerings and thank offerings on it, and told Judah to serve the LORD, the God of Israel.

The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**



SECOND READING

2 Corinthians 2:5–11

If anyone has caused grief, he has not so much grieved me as he has grieved all of you to some extent—not to put it too severely. The punishment inflicted on him by the majority is sufficient. Now instead, you ought to forgive and comfort him, so that he will not be overwhelmed by excessive sorrow. I urge you, therefore, to reaffirm your love for him.

Another reason I wrote you was to see if you would stand the test and be obedient in everything. Anyone you forgive, I also forgive. And what I have forgive—if there was anything to forgive—I have forgiven in the sight of Christ for your sake, in order that Satan might not outwit us. For we are not unaware of his schemes.

GOSPEL Mark 5:1–20

This man lived in the tombs, and no one could bind him anymore, not even with a chain. For he had often been chained hand and foot, but he tore the chains apart and broke the irons on his feet. No one was strong enough to subdue him. Night and day among the tombs and in the hills he would cry out and cut himself with stones.

When he saw Jesus from a distance, he ran and fell on his knees in front of him. He shouted at the top of his voice, "What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? In God's name don't torture me!" For Jesus had said to him, "Come out of this man, you impure spirit!"

Then Jesus asked him, "What is your name?"

"My name is Legion," he replied, "for we are many." And he begged Jesus again and again not to send them out of the area.

A large herd of pigs was feeding on the nearby hillside. The demons begged Jesus, "Send us among the pigs; allow us to go into them." He gave them permission, and the impure spirits came out and went into the pigs. The herd, about two thousand in number, rushed down the steep bank into the lake and were drowned.

Those tending the pigs ran off and reported this in the town and countryside, and the people went out to see what had happened.

When they came to Jesus, they saw the man who had been possessed by the legion of demons, sitting there, dressed and in his right mind; and they were afraid. Those who had seen it told the people what had happened to the demon-possessed man—and told about the pigs as well. Then the people began to plead with Jesus to leave their region.

As Jesus was getting into the boat, the man who had been demonpossessed begged to go with him. Jesus did not let him, but said, "Go home to your own people and tell them how much the Lord has done for you, and how he has had mercy on you." So the man went away and began to tell in the Decapolis how much Jesus had done for him. And all the people were amazed.

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Turning Obstacles into Opportunities

I want you to know, brothers and sisters that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel, so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard and to all the rest that my imprisonment is for Christ. Philippians 1:12-13

If you have ever tried to follow Paul throughout his missionary journeys, you know how dizzying it can feel. His travels in the Book of Acts can leave you breathless. He is constantly on the move, going from place to place.

It would seem that the worst thing that could ever happen to someone like Paul is to be stuck in the same house for two years. At the conclusion of Acts, that is exactly how we find him (Acts 28:30-31).

You can just imagine the devil's response to Paul's house arrest: "Now I've shut him up! That'll get rid of him!" Quite the opposite happened! It was during Paul's imprisonment that he penned some of his most noteworthy letters under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

Paul was a different kind of prisoner. The soldiers who guarded him may have noticed he was not like other prisoners who cussed, screamed, agitated others, and insisted on his innocence. Instead, Paul had joy and purpose, and he just wouldn't stop going on about Christ Jesus!

As a result of Paul's daily ministry among these soldiers, word began to spread throughout the entire palace guard: The reason this guy is a prisoner is because of Jesus. They got the point: "He's chained to us because he's chained to this man Jesus Christ." It appears that some of these guards not only heard the gospel, but they were led to faith. When they were redeployed throughout the Roman Empire, the gospel would advance to various places through them! Paul's imprisonment might have been seen as an obstacle, but God proved it to be an opportunity.

Our work at Institutional Ministries is no different. Chaplains and volunteers meet people behind various walls who come from all walks of life. Many of them feel stuck. People who are chained to struggles, become connected to us, as we are connected to Christ. In turn, many of them now share the love of Christ with others!

The Lord turns obstacles to opportunities.

We don't need to wait for all the circumstances in life to line up before we can talk about Jesus. You might a be Bible study leader in a county jail or prison, visiting with someone who is hospitalized, a humble prayer warrior, or a generous heart who offers financial support. Whether you realize it or not, you are never far from someone who needs to know the amazing story of God's grace. What might be seen as obstacles God can turn to opportunities. We join with you to thank God for the many partnership opportunities we share to connect more people to Christ.
