Sermon followed by Service

August 20, 2023

2 Kings 6:8-17

What's your favorite angel story? I think of Colorado, driving out in the sand-hills, the oil-field, pasture-lands, of eastern Colorado. I was driving on a paved highway that became a paved road that became a gravel road (wide) that became a gravel road (narrow) with hills going up and down so you couldn't see what was coming. Heading up one of those hills, I got the nudge, "You better move over." And somehow there was enough room on the top of the hill for me a speeding oil-tanker semi. I'd like to claim credit for moving over, but I'm not that good a guesser. And I'm not that good a driver. A bit further down the road I'm full speed off the road, into the ditch, and then back on the road again without flipping over or getting stuck. My Mercury Zephyr was no Land-cruiser, and I'm no Mario Andretti. So I'm convinced it was God and his angels who got me home safely.

I imagine most all of us have our favorite angel stories. Have you ever wondered what the angels think of as their favorite angel stories? One has to be Christmas Eve with the angel appearing to the shepherds: "I bring you Good News of great joy: today in the town of David a Savior is born." And before that, the angel Gabriel appearing to the young virgin Mary: "Greetings you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you. You will be the mother of God's forever King." ... With this topper: "With God nothing is impossible." Or in the wilderness, after Jesus was baptized for battle, when Jesus faced off against Satan and put Satan in his place, we're told angels came and tended to Jesus. Or in the Garden of Gethsemene, when the weight of the world's guilt was coming down on Jesus, when the thought of his Father cursing him was crushing down on him, when Peter, James and John couldn't stay awake to be there for him, an angel came and tended to Jesus, helping him get ready for the cross. Makes me wonder how hard it was for the angels to leave Jesus alone on the cross as the Father judged Jesus for your sin and my sin.

But then on Easter, who is on the scene again? The angels telling the Good News of Easter: "He is not here; he is risen!" And now today, what is the angels' favorite thing to talk about? God's plan, his power, his promise - saving us from Satan. God's plan, his power, his promise in Jesus - saving sinners from their sin; forgiving us, God forgiving you and me. And this - God's plan, his power, his promise - that we - you and me - we get to join the angels in heaven with Jesus. I think I talked myself into a new favorite angel story - the angels praising God that we get to join them in heaven! You may have a different favorite angel story. Today, we see one of my favorite angel sightings in all the Bible.

We don't know when this happened, whether before or after Naaman. If it were after Elisha healed Naaman, we'd like to think that Aram and Israel would be getting along happily ever after in this lesson. If it were before Elisha healed Naaman, we'd like to think that Aram and Israel would be getting along happily ever after in that lesson. Either way, what do we see? Israel and Aram and their kings were not getting along happily ever after. The king of Aram was at war against Israel. He'd make his war plans: "We'll set up camp here." But then Elisha would send word to the king of Israel who would send out his scouts, find the enemy, and stay clear and safe. This didn't just happen once or twice, so the king of Aram gets suspicious - "Who's the spy? Who's the traitor, telling the enemy our battle plans?" By this time Elisha was well-known and it was no secret in Israel who was warning the king and passing along the enemy's secrets. And because it was no secret in Israel who Elisha was and what Elisha was doing, it was no secret to Aram's spies who Elisha was, what Elisha was doing, and where Elisha was.

So the king of Aram sends his army south to solve his Elisha problem. He doesn't just send a SWAT team to take Elisha; he sends an army unit with horses and chariots, enough to surround the city where Elisha was staying. Overnight, they do just that; they surround the city while the city was sleeping. Early the next morning, Elisha's servant gets up and goes out and finds an army with horses and chariots surrounding the city. Can you imagine what goes through his mind? What comes out of his mouth? "How do you say "Yikes!" in Hebrew? Then to Elisha, "O lord, what will we do?"

Elisha is calm, confident. No "yikes" from Elisha. He's confident; the LORD has got him, and so the LORD has got this too. Elisha answers his servant: "**Don't be afraid. Those who are with us are more than those who are with them.**" That's too good to just hear once. "**Don't be afraid. Those who are**

with us are more than those who are with them." Elisha wasn't talking about Israel's army; Israel's army had been working to avoid Aram's army. No, Elisha had a different army in mind, the army commanded by the LORD of hosts. He prays: "Oh, LORD, open his eyes so he may see." So the LORD opened the servant's eyes so he saw the hills full of horses and chariots of fire all around. Elisha knew, and now his servant saw: with the LORD and his angels, they had nothing to be afraid of.

Abraham saw the LORD and two angels appear as men; Jacob saw angels ascending and descending on a stairway to heaven; the writer to the Hebrews describes angels as ministering spirits. Here in our lesson angels appear as horses and chariots of fire. Different kinds of angels? Angels appearing in different ways? When Jesus shows us his angels in the book of Revelation, what do we see? Different kinds of angels, and they appeared in some very different ways.

But what is true of all of them? God created them; God commands them; they listen to God; and something else - God uses them for you. How? In a way that should leave us calm and confident. God sends his angels to serve us and protect us in ways we may never know, to defend us and fight for us against Satan and his spirit armies in ways we may never see.

I hesitate to say this. But what if ...? What if God commands his angels to step back? What if God commands his angels to let the enemy strike, and knock me down? Like Jacob cheated by his uncle Laban. Like Joseph sold into slavery by his brothers, thrown into prison by Potiphar. Like Job, who lost most everything he had, except God's hold on him. Like Jesus, who gave up everything he had, except his hold on God. Like Peter and the rest of the apostles.

What then? There's a part of me that doesn't want to go there, that doesn't what to think about that. But what then? Jacob, Joseph, and Job - what do we see in their lives? An incredible amount of hurt, an incredible amount of hurt turned into an incredible amount of blessing. Jacob was cheated and bullied by his uncle and father-in-law for 20 years. He was made to believe his Joseph was killed, forced to leave his promised home. Apart from a peek here and there, he couldn't see the angels; he couldn't see God. But you know - in all things, even when God had his angels step back, God worked for Jacob's good; and not just Jacob's good, in all things God worked to keep his promise for us. And Joseph - sold into slavery, thrown into prison. Yet what do we know? In all things, even when God had his angels step back, God worked for Joseph's good; and not just Joseph's good, in all things God worked to keep his promise for us. And Job - he lost his children, his riches, his wife's smile, all in a day. He lost his health in a most awful way. Yet what do we know? In all things, even when God had his angels step back, God worked for Job's good. You know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him.

For Jacob, Joseph, and Job, we see their lives go from pain to comfort. What about Peter and the rest of the apostles? What about when God's angels let the knife cut and the cross kill? One of the twelve, John, shows us a picture from Jesus. He reveals a revelation from Jesus. And what do we see? Angels, countless angels, angels around the throne of God with Jesus and his Father. We see and hear angels singing back and forth, singing about the Savior and the saints he's saving. But not just singing about those saints. We see and hear the angels singing with the saints.

When they were here in this world, the saints in heaven they were like us; they couldn't see when the angels were stepping in and when they were stepping back. In this life, it may well have looked like the angels were doing more stepping back than stepping in. But what do we see in heaven? The saints and angels singing together in heaven. What do they know? God with his angels will get his people home!

"But what if?" How do we put those words to rest? Listen to Elisha: "**Those who are with us are more than those who are against us.**" Listen to the Psalm writer: "**He [the Most High] will command his angels to guard you in all your ways.**" Listen to Jesus promise that he has his angels watching out. And if God has them step back? Even then God is working his plan and promise for the good of his people. Even then, God has his angels at the ready, ready to step in for you and for yours. Even then, and always, we get to know we still have our favorite angel time ahead of us. How so? Some day we'll we singing with the saints and angels in heaven. Singing, "Thank you, Lord, for Jesus, and his angels!" Amen.
