September 1, 2024

Daniel 12

Picture your favorite picture of heaven. The wedding banquet - the feast - the city with streets paved with gold - paradise with the river of life and the tree of life. Picture your favorite picture of heaven - life the way it's supposed to be with no more death or mourning or crying or pain.

What's your favorite picture of heaven? Have you shared this with family and friends?

What's between now and then, here and there? In the book of Revelation, Jesus shows John, and John shows us. In our lesson today, Jesus told Daniel, and Daniel tells us. Daniel called it a great warfare. Jesus called it a time of distress. When you hear that word "distress," what comes to mind? A time of uncontrollable, heart-rending pain and tears. In the English, distress can mean agony. In the Hebrew, the word is even more painful. Distress is the feeling of being bound up, trapped, no where to go, no one to help; distress is the feeling that the world is about to crush you. In the Bible, distress describes the pain of childbirth, the fear of facing an army, a bloodthirsty, raping army.

Jesus told Daniel, "**There will be a time of distress such as has not happened from the beginning of nations until then.**" Worse than what Daniel faced when he was torn from his home and sent into captivity. Worse than what Jerusalem faced when it was attacked and destroyed by Nebuchadnezzar. Worse

than what God's people faced in the first part of Daniel chapter 11, when God's people would be attacked for their faith, tortured on the rack, cooked in brass pots. **“There will be a time of distress such as has not happened from the beginning of nations until then.”** In the last part of Daniel 11, Jesus tells Daniel the warfare, the distress wouldn't just be political, but religious, not just physical, but spiritual. In our Gospel lesson, we heard Jesus tell his disciples it would be a time of wars and rumors of wars, pitting people against each other, killing, destroying, tearing people apart; a time of false teachers and false Christs twisting truth and so twisting hearts and hope; a time of more and more wickedness, a time when hearts, most hearts will turn cold, uncaring. At that time, it will look like the church can not and will not survive. In Revelation, Jesus pictures this time this way - beasts of evil and judgments from God until Satan and his forces of evil from all over the world have God's people surrounded, about to be destroyed.

We hear that and we wonder. Like Daniel, we wonder: “How long? What do we do?”

Jesus has a pair of angels helping Daniel to understand. How long? **“A time, times, and half a time.” “From the time that the daily sacrifice is abolished and the abomination that causes desolation is set up, there will be 1,290 days. Blessed is the one who waits for and reaches the end of the 1,335 days.”** The angel's answer doesn't help much, does it? We'll look it more in Bible Class. Here, let me just say this: “a time” - a set time, “times” - a set time that seems to go on and on, “and half a time” - a set time that seems to go on and on and on, but then

mercifully, it comes to a quick end. How long will that warfare, this time of distress, last? A long time; a long, long time; but a set time.

What do we do with that? That's what Daniel wanted to know. Here's the angels' answer: **"Go your way. Go your way till the end."** The answer isn't: "Hunker down and hide." The answer isn't: "Stand up and fight." So what are we to do? **"Go your way."**

In this time of distress, how do you see Christ's church dealing with the distress of Satan's war against God and his church?

I expected more. A sentence, a paragraph, a page, something more than **"Go your way."** In fact, God did give us more, a whole book of the Bible - 1 Peter, a letter for Christians living in a hostile, anti-Christian world. But here, just: **"Go your way."** With the world echoing in my ears - "Be true to yourself. Do what you want. Do whatever feels right to you." - it's easy to hear **"Go your way"** in a way that God doesn't mean. But God isn't speaking to the world out there. And God isn't speaking to the world in me. God is speaking to Daniel, a man of God, a child of God, a servant of God. A child and servant of God whose first care and concern is to seek first the kingdom of God - to live and to do for the glory of God and the good of his people. That was Daniel's way. And so the angel says: **"Go your way."**

And now, today, how do we hear “**Go your way**”? Not as people of the world, but as people of God. People who know: “**Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path.**” People who know: “**Love the LORD your God with all your heart.**” People who know: “**Love your neighbor as yourself.**” So here and today, God speaks to you and to me, like he spoke to Daniel, as people who aren’t set on living life for self, but as people eager to live life God’s way - for the glory of God and the good of his people. That’s why God can say “**Go your way,**” because he knows we sing: “Let us ever walk with Jesus.”

How do you understand the angel’s answer: “Go your way”?

What Bible lessons, hymns ... especially inspire, encourage, guide “your way” in facing the distress of evil’s war against God and his people?

It’s not easy, is it? We see what the powers of evil are doing out there, we feel what the powers of evil are doing in here [our hearts], we see the world war against God and we feel the distress, and we wonder: “How? How in the world can I live the life God has for me? How will I ever be able to make it?”

Jesus has a promise for us, or a set of promises for us. For one, we’re not alone in the battle. A couple weeks ago we heard him promise: “**Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged. For the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go.**” Today, Jesus adds for Daniel and for us: “**At that time Michael, the great prince who protects your people, will arise.**” We’ll

talk more about Michael and the angels on “Michael and the Angels Sunday” on September 29. Today, as Satan and his demon forces wage their war of evil against God and his people, today Jesus has the archangel Michael and his armies standing up to fight for us. Put that together with what we have already seen in Daniel ... No matter how the people powers of this world wage their war of evil against God and his people, we have the Rock (chapter 2) crushing and replacing every earthly power; we get to know - in the end, our Rock will rule forever. At the same time, no matter how the powers of this world distress us, we get to see the Son of Man (chapter 7) setting up his kingdom in heaven, setting us up to rule with him in heaven forever. Yes, we get to rule with Jesus in heaven. We might wonder: “How can that be? After what evil has done to us, scarring us ... after what we have done, joining in the sin of the world, joining in the guilt of the world, how can it be that we aren’t crushed and replaced, how can it be that we aren’t thrown into the fires of judgment, how can it be that we get to be with Jesus and even rule with Jesus? Daniel chapter 9 - in Jesus, God has put an end to our rebellion against him; in Jesus, God has put an end to our sin; in Jesus, our sin and guilt are forgiven, and in Jesus, we are made right for life made right with God. Today, that’s true, no matter what happens around us or to us.

What’s your favorite promise to get you through these end time?

How have you shared that promise with others? How recently?

How does the book of Daniel help you through these end times?

With whom have you shared the message of Daniel?

And some day, like Daniel - some day, as we sang earlier - some day “to faithful warriors comes their rest.” Rest. No more distress around us, no more distress inside us. We get to look forward to rest with Jesus. But even better, we get to look forward to getting up, to rising, to resurrection. Our end isn’t just rest and relief from our distress. We get to look forward to waking up to a new life, life the way it’s supposed to be in heaven. And that favorite picture of heaven you have, you’ll find the real heaven is even better. Amen.

We didn’t touch on it in this sermon, but looking at Daniel 12:9, how do you see yourself being purified and refined during this time of distress? How does that verse shape your understanding of your purpose in this time of evil’s warfare against God and his people?



GOSPEL

Mark 13:1–2, 5–8, 13–15, 20–23, 26–27

As Jesus was leaving the temple, one of his disciples said to him, “Look, Teacher! What massive stones! What magnificent buildings!”

“Do you see all these great buildings?” replied Jesus. “Not one stone here will be left on another; every one will be thrown down.”

Jesus said to them: “Watch out that no one deceives you. Many will come in my name, claiming, ‘I am he,’ and will deceive many. When you hear of wars and rumors of wars, do not be alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be earthquakes in various places, and famines. These are the beginning of birth pains.

Everyone will hate you because of me, but the one who stands firm to the end will be saved.

“When you see ‘the abomination that causes desolation’ standing where it does not belong—let the reader understand—then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains. Let no one on the housetop go down or enter the house to take anything out.

“If the Lord had not cut short those days, no one would survive. But for the sake of the elect, whom he has chosen, he has shortened them. At that time if anyone says to you, ‘Look, here is the Messiah!’ or, ‘Look, there he is!’ do not believe it. For false messiahs and false prophets will appear and perform signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect. So be on your guard; I have told you everything ahead of time.

“At that time people will see the Son of Man coming in clouds with great power and glory. And he will send his angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of the heavens.

SERMON

Daniel 12

NICENE CREED
