Sermon followed by Service

September 22, 2024

Mark 10:2-12

The bride and groom were standing together before God. Before God and family and friends they were about to answer one of the most important questions of their lives. "Will you take this woman to be your wife? Will you take this man to be your husband? Will you be guided by the counsel and direction God has given in his Word? Will you be faithful to her, cherish her, support her ... will you help him in sickness and in health as long as you both shall live? If so, answer, 'I will." Then, before God and the world, he looked deep into her eyes ... she looked deep into his, and together they answered: "Whatever. We'll see."

With their hearts beating, they exchanged rings and the minister said: "I now present to you man and wife." And the ladies thought: "how cute," and the guys thought: "I wonder if there's open bar at the reception," and all together they clapped and thought: "Whatever."

"Whatever" ... sounds so romantic, doesn't it? So loving it makes our hearts warm inside. Hearing our loved one promise "whatever" makes us want to reach out in love ... hearing "whatever" makes us want to give ourselves to serve them the rest of our lives, doesn't it?

No, it doesn't. "Whatever" may be more honest than "I do" or "I will." But it doesn't sound romantic or loving or like

much of a promise at all. So why do so many married people say: "Whatever"? And not just married people, but unmarried people playing together like they're married people ... why do so many pretenders and boyfriends and girlfriends say "Whatever"?

Because playing whatever is easier than trusting and loving. Playing whatever is easier than sacrificing self the way that real love does. "Whatever" is easier than "I trust you with my life and my heart and my everything." "Whatever" is easier than "I give myself to God and to you to take care of you the rest of our lives." "Whatever" is so much easier than giving the heart and making the sacrifices that real love and marriage take.

But "whatever" sounds so ugly, doesn't it? So instead of saying it out loud, our world of love pretenders just thinks it. Instead of saying it out loud, our world of pretenders says "NO" to God as they say "YES" to our wants and our fears and our feelings because no one should ever have to say "NO" to their feelings, right? There was a time I could stop there, enough said. But today, "no one should ever have to say 'NO' to their feelings" doesn't sound silly; it sounds right. That's what our world is teaching us. That our feelings - "I love you ... I love you not" are wiser than God. And that our world's feelings about homosexuality and same-sex marriage, and hooking up, and divorce are wiser and more right than God. And so we set our feelings up as god and we do whatever.

And God cringes. God cringes. Jesus cringes. Because God designed marriage to be the closest of relationships, the safest, the purest of relationships, to reflect the relationship he

wants with us. So when God sees what this world has done with marriage, he cringes. When he sees what we have done with our own marriages, he cringes. Because God gave his Son to be husband for the church, husband for us, to care for us and make us inseparably one with God. So when we twist God's design for marriage, when we are unfaithful to God's design for marriage, God cringes in hurt and in anger.

God could have turned away, walked away, written us off. Instead God sent Jesus for us. Not as sex police to condemn the world. Not as marriage counselor to teach us. But Jesus came to give his life for us, to take our place. Accepting our filth as his own, Jesus was lumped together, shamed with the dirty ones. Taking our guilt as his own, Jesus was charged as the pretender, mocked as the fake and the fraud. Taking our place, Jesus was condemned as the unfaithful one. And God gave to Jesus what we had coming for making our feelings to be god in place of God.

In turn, Jesus took all the charges against us, all our dirty little secrets, everything that would shame us on earth and in heaven. He tore them up. He washed them away, forgiven and gone. He sees you and calls you: Faithful and Pure, Clean and Right. He sees you as the world's most beautiful bride; better, he sees you as heaven's most beautiful bride. He calls you right for life with God, right for life in heaven. Why? To win your heart ... to give you his love ... to share with you the glories of his heaven. And to set you and your family up for his blessing in this world.

Jesus wants the best of God's blessing for you and your family. So, in our lesson, when Jesus was questioned about marriage and divorce, Jesus didn't settle for "whatever." He didn't turn to the marriage experts of the day. He didn't base his answer on public opinion. He didn't try to go with the flow of people's thinking and feeling. No, Jesus wants better for you. He wants you and your family blessed by God. So Jesus went straight to God's plan for marriage — "at the beginning of creation God 'made them male and female.' 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one. Therefore what God has joined together, let man not separate."

In God's perfect world, God could have designed marriage to be whatever - whoever, however, whenever, for however long. But God wants better than whatever for us. He wants husband and wife to know their hearts and their hopes and dreams are safe together "til death do us part." He wants husband and wife to be loved and respected without distraction or competition. He wants children to grow up feeling safe as mom and dad surround them with peace and love. He wants children to grow up learning from mom and dad how to love and care for each other. He wants husbands and wives and moms and dads and children to learn God's love and to experience God's love as they love and take care of each other. So God didn't say "whatever." God said: "Here's my design. Here's my way to bless you."

We live in a world that would rather say "whatever" to get whatever it wants. But we have a heart touched by Jesus, a heart alive with the Spirit of Jesus. So we don't settle for whatever. We don't deal out whatever. Instead we share the heart of Christ. How? If you have a husband or a wife, don't treat them as a whatever. Treat him, treat her as one of God's most precious blessings, God's wonderful match for you and your heart. If you are looking for that match, or if you think you've found that match, don't treat him or her with whatever dirt, whatever pretending the world thinks right. Treat him, treat her as a pure gift with a heart made pure in Jesus. And if God blesses you to live without that special match, know this - that God has his special SomeOne for you, just as he does for the rest of us. SomeOne who isn't just a whoever or a whatever, but SomeOne who is the Prince of heaven and the Son of God. In Jesus, God gives us his perfect Match to make us complete. In Jesus, God gives us his perfect SomeOne, his perfect Son, to give us life right with God forever. And that, my friends, is better than "whatever." Amen.

IN OUR WORLD TODAY ... we can feel so pressed and so distracted/destructed, so pushed and pulled ... and who gets pushed and pulled and pressed and distracted/destructed with us? FIRST READING Genesis 2:18–25

So the man gave names to all the livestock, the birds in the sky and all the wild animals.

But for Adam no suitable helper was found. So the LORD God caused the man to fall into a deep sleep; and while he was sleeping, he took one of the man's ribs and then closed up the place with flesh. Then the LORD God made a woman from the rib he had taken out of the man, and he brought her to the man.


The man said,

SECOND READING

Ephesians 5:21-6:4

Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands as you do to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything.

Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless. In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. After all, no one ever hated their own body, but they feed and care for their body, just as Christ does the church—for we are members of his body. "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh."

This is a profound mystery—but I am talking about Christ and the church. However, each one of you also must love his wife as he loves himself, and the wife must respect her husband.

Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother"—which is the first commandment with a promise— "so that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth."

Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.

GOSPEL Mark 10:2–16

Some Pharisees came and tested him by asking, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?"

"What did Moses command you?" he replied.

They said, "Moses permitted a man to write a certificate of divorce and send her away."

"It was because your hearts were hard that Moses wrote you this law," Jesus replied. "But at the beginning of creation God 'made them male and female.' 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

When they were in the house again, the disciples asked Jesus about this. He answered, "Anyone who divorces his wife and marries another woman commits adultery against her. And if she divorces her husband and marries another man, she commits adultery."

People were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them.

When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." And he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on them and blessed them.
