Sermon followed by Service

September 29, 2024 - St Michael and All Angels

Revelation 12:7

There's a world out there we can't see. A world that sometimes creeps us out. A world that sometimes wows us, sometimes for the wrong reasons. Over this next month, with Halloween coming, we'll hear talk of haunted houses, devils and demons, witches and warlocks. Some of the talk will come from TV and movies; some will come from friends; some will be trying to scare you, some will be trying to entice you. Some of what they say will be made up stories, but some just might be true.

There is a world out there we can't see. A world where demons are fighting for your soul. Working to trip you, trap you, lure you, own you. And if they can't own you, they work to make your life miserable. Sometimes they use the world we see; they work in the evil of the world to tear us down; they use the good of the world to tempt us. We've all been on the wrong side of that, haven't we? But sometimes they use the powers of that other world ... they show us powers from that other world, to draw us in to places where God says: "don't go there."

There is a world out there we can't see. A world where God has his angel armies on duty for you, looking out for you, fighting for you. In that world, God and his angels are at work holding back the forces of evil, drawing God's line against evil - "so far and no further." There is a world out there we can't see, with God and his angels at work in ways we can't see. And

thinking of our Old Testament lesson, in ways that are really hard to understand.

Our lesson today gives us a look into that other world. What do we see? A war is being fought. On one side we have the archangel Michael. His name Michael means "who is like God." He stands for God's honor; as angel he serves for God's honor; as archangel he leads for God's honor; on the battlefield he fights for God's honor. As archangel, he's one of God's chief angels. As the only archangel named in the Bible, it's possible Michael is the chief, the captain of God's angels. In our Old Testament lesson, we saw Michael at work behind the scenes as protector of God's people. On the last day, we'll hear Michael blast the trumpet when Jesus returns. Here we see Michael on the battlefield with his angel army; Michael with his name - "who is like God."

On the other side we see the great pretender, the angel who tried to take God's place. The dragon who tried to destroy Jesus. The ancient serpent who led Adam and Eve into sin, who works to lead the whole world astray. He's the devil, whose name from the Greek means slanderer. Before Adam and Eve, before us, he works to slander God. Before God, he would work to slander us. As Satan, whose name from the Hebrew means accuser, he would accuse us before God.

This is the way he would work. He'd tempt us. Slandering God as untrustworthy or unloving or against us, he'd tempt us to doubt and despair; he'd tempt us to break from God. And then he'd run to God, slandering us, accusing us: "Look what they did.

Look what they think of you. I got them. They're not yours any more. They're mine. Look what they did. Look what they think of you. Curse them; damn them. Cut them loose. They're mine."

That's what the devil would do. But what do we see in our lesson? Michael and his angels fought against the devil and his demon angels. And the devil lost. He lost the battle and he lost his place in heaven.

We might be thinking; "What?! The devil had a place in heaven?" We see this again and again. God lets his enemies show off. He lets them show off how strong and how powerful they are. God lets his enemies take their best shot at him. And then what? God drops them. We see that in our lesson. The devil is hurled out of heaven. He loses his place before God. With his angels, he's hurled to the earth.

What does that mean for us? I'll give you the bad news first. The devil is mighty angry, and he has it out for God and for you. Our lesson puts it this way: "Woe to the earth and the sea, because the devil has gone down to you! He is filled with fury, because he knows that his time is short." We don't have to look far to find evidence of that, do we? The devil's on the prowl in the world slandering God, slandering those who follow God. He goes after us in Christ's church, filling the church with lies about God. He's at work with a vengeance, tempting us to doubt God's way, tempting us to run with the world. It looks as if we see the devil winning all around us, doesn't it?

But heaven has good news for us! The devil's time is short. And he's lost his most dangerous power. What do I mean? Let's hear it from heaven. In our lesson, after the victory comes the victory song. John tells us: "Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God, and the authority of his Christ. (Sound familiar?) For the accuser of our brothers, who accuses them before our God day and night, has been hurled down." Satan has lost his place to accuse us! He has lost his power to condemn us! There is a new power, a new authority in heaven who gets to have his say.

- The Christ that Satan tried to silence now has his say in heaven "It is finished!" Where the devil would accuse: "Look what they did!" Jesus says: "Look what I did; I got it done right!" And know this his right covers your wrong.
- Where Satan would condemn: "They've got to pay!" Jesus says: "I've already paid, in full!"
- Where the devil would say: "They're mine!" Jesus says: "They're mine!" You are his [Jesus'].
- Where the devil would tear our hearts apart, Jesus says "peace."

We might look around us, at all the evil around us, and think "the devil's winning." But Satan has lost his most dangerous power; he's lost his place to accuse you. Jesus gets the last word, and his word is "peace."

In our lesson Jesus gives us a peek into the other world, the spirit world with Michael and his angels doing battle with the devil and his angels. We see Satan lose his place of power. We see him hurled out of heaven. But we don't see who tossed him.

We aren't told that Michael tossed him. We aren't told that Jesus tossed him. Instead, a voice from heaven tells us how heaven sees it: "They [the accused, that's us] overcame him because of the blood of the Lamb. They overcame him because of the word of their testimony. They overcame him because they did not love their lives so much as to shrink from death." Heaven sees you standing strong with Jesus, and the devil is put in his place. Heaven hears you share the word and promise of Jesus, and the devil is put in his place. Heaven sees you washed with the blood of the Lamb, and Satan has no standing against you. Heaven sees you with Jesus, and you win: you are putting the devil in his place.

We might not always see it that way. It might not always feel that way - that the devil has been put in his place. That's why Jesus gives you this sneak peek into the spirit world. You're not alone in the fight against evil. Behind the scenes you have Michael and all his angels on duty, doing battle, fighting with you against the devil and his demon angels. And this is how the angels in heaven see it: with Jesus, you win! "Now have come the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God, and the authority of his Christ." Amen.

FIRST LESSON

In the third year of Cyrus king of Persia, a revelation was given to Daniel (who was called Belteshazzar). Its message was true and it concerned a great war. The understanding of the message came to him in a vision.

At that time I, Daniel, mourned for three weeks. I ate no choice food; no meat or wine touched my lips; and I used no lotions at all until the three weeks were over.

On the twenty-fourth day of the first month, as I was standing on the bank of the great river, the Tigris, I looked up and there before me was a man dressed in linen, with a belt of fine gold from Uphaz around his waist. His body was like topaz, his face like lightning, his eyes like flaming torches, his arms and legs like the gleam of burnished bronze, and his voice like the sound of a multitude.


I, Daniel, was the only one who saw the vision; those who were with me did not see it, but such terror overwhelmed them that they fled and hid themselves. So I was left alone, gazing at this great vision; I had no strength left, my face turned deathly pale and I was helpless. Then I heard him speaking, and as I listened to him, I fell into a deep sleep, my face to the ground.


A hand touched me and set me trembling on my hands and knees. He said, "Daniel, you who are highly esteemed, consider carefully the words I am about to speak to you, and stand up, for I have now been sent to you." And when he said this to me, I stood up trembling.

LORD'S PRAYER


